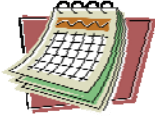

Today’s Gospel reveals what miraculous things can happen when one embraces a single-minded faith in Jesus Christ. Peter

gets out of a wind-tossed boat when the Lord calls him. His faith is tested by his obedience to Jesus who is calling him out onto the water. In the midst of the waves and the wind, Peter gets out of the boat and walks toward Jesus. Good stewards heed Christ’s call to them. Sometimes that call directs them to take on seemingly impossible challenges. This week, reflect on how the Lord could be calling you out of the safety of your own “boat” to take on the impossible.

LET'S END MODERN SLAVERY!

Did you know that you can help reduce human slavery by purchasing products labeled "Fair Trade"? This is how we support the companies that sell us our food and other products who ensure that no human slavery was used in their supply and production chain. Yes, these items usually cost more, but that is because they are not being produced using slave or under-compensated labor.)

The US State Department estimates that 21 million men, women and children are being held in some kind of forced labor—modern slavery. (Other human rights groups put the number at 35 million.) These are some of the people who harvest our food, make our clothes, gather the raw materials made for electronics, jewelry and makeup, or who are sold for "adult pleasure". They are not only in far-off places, but right here in the Monterey Bay region. What can we do? First of all, educate ourselves. SAINTS OF THE WEEK

August 13: *St. Pontian, Pope and Martyr and St. Hippolytus, Priest and Martyr.* Pontian was a Roman who served as Bishop of Rome from 230-235. The Roman emperor banished Pontian to Sardinia where he died of harsh treatment. Hippolytus was one of the most influential theologians of the early Church. Hippolytus had a love of orthodox truth that was sometimes excessive. He criticized the Church leaders of his time for not being tough enough with heretics and even had himself elected the first anti-pope. He was exiled to Sardinia at the same time as Pontian, and was reconciled to the Church by Pontian.

August 14: *St. Maximilian Mary Kolbe, Priest and Martyr.* The story of Maximilian Kolbe is one of the most dramatic and inspirational of the 20th century, if not in Church history. He was a dynamic Franciscan priest in Poland who was sent to Auschwitz in 1941 for speaking out against Nazism. One day when a prisoner escaped, the commandant ordered that ten men would be sent to the starvation cell as punishment. When one of them began to weep for his wife and family, Maximilian stepped forward and asked to take his place. "Who are you?" asked the commandant. "A priest." Maximilian was allowed to take the man's place and spent his last days giving strength and inspiration to the other nine men. By August 14th only Kolbe and three others were still alive, and they were killed by lethal injection. His body was cremated the next day, the Solemnity of the Assumption of his beloved Mary. Pope John Paul II canonized Maximilian in 1982.

August 15: *The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.* After a broad consultation of the faith of the Church, Pope Pius XII defined as infallible the dogma of the Assumption of Mary. This feast has been celebrated in the Church since at least the 5th century, and the pope simply acknowledged its validity. It is our belief that, at the time of her death, Mary was taken bodily into heaven. This reminds us of our belief that our future heavenly existence will be a physical one as well.

August 16: *St. Stephen of Hungary.* Stephen was born around 975 and baptized ten years later along with his father, a tribal chieftain. When he succeeded his father as leader, Stephen set about Christianizing his people. He is recognized as first king of Hungary.

August 18: *St. Jane Frances de Chantal.* Jane Frances was a wife, mother, nun, and foundress of the Visitation Sisters. Three of her six children died as babies, and her husband was killed after seven years of marriage. A few years later she met St. Frances de Sales, who became her spiritual director. In 1607 he asked her to help him start a cloisterless, alternative religious order for women which would enable them to do active ministry, in imitation of Mary at the Visitation. Cultural fears of religious women working outside a cloister prevailed, however, and Jane Frances and her companions were forced to work within a cloister. Still, they served the poor and suffering the best they could. St. Vincent de Paul said of her, "I regard her as one of the holiest souls I have ever met on this earth."

SAFETY: Please be mindful of your possessions both inside your cars and inside the buildings. We have had some thefts in our buildings. It only takes a second for something to be taken. Please be sure to lock your cars and do not leave valuable items in sight in your cars when you come to church. Either leave them at home or lock them out of sight and be sure to keep your possessions with you when you are inside the buildings. Thank you.



PARENTS—ABOUT YOUR CHILD'S SAFETY: We know that this is of utmost importance to you, as it is to us. Most of us generally assume that mass and church events are always safe places for our children, and they usually are. But since these gatherings are open to the general public, we have to be mindful of the possibility of



disturbed or even dangerous persons coming into our midst. Please keep your children in sight at all times. We are particularly concerned about the Sunday morning donut hospitality time, when some children enter the hall without their parents. It is not safe for them to be in the hall without parental supervision, so please don't let that happen. Let's all take responsibility for making sure that our parish is a safe place for all our children!
