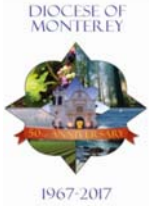

LET'S END MODERN SLAVERY!

Did you know that you can help reduce human slavery by purchasing products labeled "Fair Trade"? This is how we support the companies that sell us our food and other products who ensure that no human slavery was used in their supply and production chain. Yes, these items usually cost more, but that is because they are not being produced using slave or under-compensated labor.)

The US State Department estimates that 21 million men, women and children are being held in some kind of forced labor—modern slavery. (Other human



rights groups put the number at 35 million.) These are some of the people who harvest our food, make our clothes, gather the raw materials made for electronics, jewelry and

makeup, or who are sold for "adult pleasure". They are not only in far-off places, but right here in the Monterey Bay region. What can we do? First of all, educate ourselves. MEMORANDUM

To: Priests, Deacons, Parish Offices, School Principals and School Offices

Subject: Flu Awareness and Liturgical Changes
Date: January 10, 2018

Once again, we are in the midst of the flu season, which is quite widespread. I would like to encourage pastors to make temporary liturgical changes, if you deem it necessary, as we attempt to do our part to reduce the likelihood of the flu's spread.

Please remind the faithful that they are never obliged to attend Sunday Mass when they are sick and not feeling well. If they are at Mass and are not feeling well, they should be considerate enough to avoid receiving the Precious Blood from the communion cup. Receiving from the cup is always optional. If at all possible, emphasizing reception of the consecrated host in the hand instead of the tongue for this period of time is recommended as well.

The suggestion can also be made that if someone is not feeling well that they should avoid holding hands during the Our Father, and also shaking hands during the Kiss of Peace.

Reminding Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist to wash their hands before Mass begins or to use hand sanitizer prior to distributing communion is also important.

These suggestions are only temporary and can be implemented by pastors and parish staffs at your discretion for as long as you believe it to be necessary.
