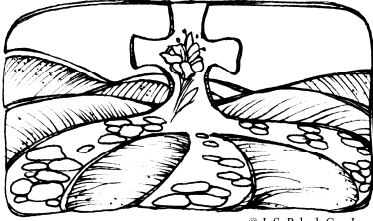

You Are Not Alone – “Santa Cruz County Sheriff’s Office now offers the ‘You Are Not Alone’ (YANA) program to provide phone calls to homebound seniors and those with disabilities to promote peace of mind and a sense of confidence living alone, as well as for their families. YANA is an excellent program for those who enjoy living independently but do not have friends or family living close by to regularly check in on them.”

How It Works

- Telephone calls are made twice a week by a Sheriff volunteer at prearranged times.
- If the participant does not answer after several attempts at contact, a volunteer and or Deputy will be dispatched to ensure the participants safety and well-being.

LET'S END MODERN SLAVERY!

Did you know that you can help reduce human slavery by purchasing products labeled "Fair Trade"? This is how we support the companies that sell us our food and other products who ensure that no human slavery was used in their supply and production chain. Yes, these items usually cost more, but that is because they are not being produced using slave or under-compensated labor.) The US State Department estimates that 21 million men, women and children are being held in some kind of forced labor—modern slavery. (Other human rights groups put the number at 35 million.) These are some of the people who harvest our food, make our clothes, gather the raw materials made for electronics, jewelry and makeup, or who are sold for "adult pleasure". They are not only in far-off places, but right here in the Monterey Bay region. What can we do? First of all, educate ourselves. Idaho Mission Trip for High School Students

Thirty-three of our teens and chaperones will be heading to Lapwai, Idaho June 11 - 19, 2017. This is the fourth year that our youth have made the journey via car, train, and van to help serve the Nez Perce Tribe. This will be the eighth year that Deborah & Hal Rovick have been leading teens to Lapwai. Over the years they have developed a relationship of trust with the native people. They look forward to our trip every year. Our teens will be working on several projects this year. In the past we have constructed a handicap ramp for one of the elders of the tribe, rebuilt the Trading Post, assembled a play structure, and built three salmon smokers.



You can participate in our trip without leaving home in several ways: you can pray for the group and the people of the Nez Perce Tribe, you can put your name on a rock and it will be placed in the cement work as a constant reminder to the people that people in Aptos, CA care about them and are praying for them. Or you can put your name on a paintbrush as we will be painting City Hall at street level. You can also help sponsor one of our youth. We ask each participant to pay for part of their trip. They pay \$400.00. In actuality the cost to send one person last year was \$600.00. We are still calculating the cost this year but don't expect it to be less than last year. Please stop by the table in the church entrance the weekend of May 20/21 to sign your name on a rock or paintbrush and leave a donation. Donation envelopes are currently available on the counter above the bulletins.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK:

May 13: *Our Lady of Fatima.* On this day in 1917, Mary appeared to three young peasant children in Fatima, Portugal and asked them to pray for the conversion of Russia. This puzzled many people at the time since Russia had been a Christian nation for centuries. But the communist revolution came a few months later and did its best to eradicate Christianity. At the direction of Our Lady of Fatima, Catholics prayed for the conversion of Russia for 70 years. Then, suddenly, the communist empire fell, and many historians say it wouldn't have happened without the influence of Pope John Paul II, who fulfilled Our Lady of Fatima's request that Russia be consecrated to her Immaculate Heart. Prayer *and* wise action can and will change our world!

May 14: *St. Matthias, Apostle.* The Acts of the Apostles 1:15-26 tells us how he was chosen to take the place of Judas. According to legend, Matthias proclaimed the gospel in Judea, Turkey and on the shores of the Caspian Sea, where he was martyred.

May 15: *St. Isidore the Farmer, husband.* Born in Spain of poor parents in 1070, Isidore spent his life working on the farm of a wealthy landowner. He and his wife Maria, also a saint, were humble, simple and noted for their kindness to animals.

May 18: *Pope St. John I, pope & martyr.* John was chosen pope during the reign of a Roman emperor who believed the Arian heresy (which denied that Jesus was fully God). When the emperor suspected John of conspiring against him, he had John imprisoned. John died from the harsh treatment he received in prison in 526.
