Research shows less than 1/3 of people recognize the sign of stroke.

Learn as many stroke symptoms as possible so you can recognize stroke **FAST** and save a life!

- ★ SUDDEN numbness or weakness of face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body
- ★ SUDDEN confusion, trouble speaking, or understanding
- ★ SUDDEN trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- ★ SUDDEN trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- ★ SUDDEN severe headache with no known cause

Call 9-1-1 immediately if you observe any of these symptoms. Note the time of the first symptom. This information is important and can affect treatment decisions.

LET'S END MODERN SLAVERY!

Did you know that you can help reduce human slavery by purchasing products labeled "Fair Trade"? This is how we support the companies that sell us our food and other products who ensure that no human slavery was used in their supply and production chain. Yes, these items usually cost more, but that is because they are not being produced using slave or under-compensated labor.)

The US State Department estimates that 21 million men, women and children are being held in some kind of forced labor—modern slavery. (Other human rights groups put the number at 35 million.) These are some of the people who harvest our food, make our clothes, gather the raw materials made for electronics, jewelry and makeup, or who are sold for "adult pleasure". They are not only in far-off places, but right here in the Monterey Bay region. What can we do? First of all, educate ourselves. SAINTS OF THE WEEK:

May 20: *St. Bernadine of Siena, priest.* Bernadine was born in 1380 in Siena, Italy. At age 20, when the plague was at its height in Siena, Bernadine helped to run the town hospital. Then he spent a year caring for a beloved aunt. After she died, he fasted and prayed to know God's will for his life. God led him to join the Franciscans, and spent nearly 12 years in solitude and prayer. He then was called to preach, and was the most dynamic preacher of his time. Bernadine was especially devoted to the Holy Name of Jesus, and to encourage others he devised the "IHS" symbol (the first three letters of "Jesus" in the Greek alphabet). Once in Bologna, when Bernadine was preaching against gambling and was leading people in burning playing cards and other gambling items, a maker of playing cards complained that Bernadine was taking away his livelihood. Bernadine told him to start making "IHS" cards, and the man made more money than ever!

May 25: *Venerable Bede, priest & doctor. Pope St. Gregory VII. St. Mary Magdalene de Pazzi, virgin.*

May 26: *St. Philip Neri, priest.* Philip Neri was born in Florence in 1515 and moved to Rome as a young man. He studied philosophy and theology for three years, but did not seek ordination to the priesthood. Instead, he began to gather people of all kinds, from beggars to bishops and cardinals, for daily times of informal prayer and spiritual discussion. He also led his followers in serving the poor of Rome. (One of his followers was the great composer Palestrina, who wrote music for their gatherings.) After 13 years of this ministry, Philip was ordained a priest and became a gifted confessor, using his wonderful sense of humor to disarm his penitents. Philip's group eventually was instituted as the Oratory, which still exists in many countries today. Philip was a behind-the-scenes participant in the Council of Trent and one of the most influential figures of the Catholic Reformation. His great contribution was to help Church leaders grow in joyful personal holiness. He died in 1595.

Idaho Mission Trip for High School Students

Thirty-three of our teens and chaperones will be heading to Lapwai, Idaho June 11 - 19, 2017. This is the fourth year that our youth have made the journey via car, train, and van to help serve the Nez Perce Tribe. This will be the eighth year that Deborah & Hal Rovick have been leading teens to Lapwai. Over the years they have developed a relationship of trust with the native people. They look forward to our trip every year. Our teens will be working on several projects this year. In the past we have constructed a handicap ramp for one of the elders of the tribe, rebuilt the Trading Post, assembled a play structure, and built three salmon smokers.

You can participate in our trip without leaving home in several ways: you can pray for the group and the people of the Nez Perce Tribe, you can put your name on a rock and it will be placed in the cement work as a constant reminder to the people that people in Aptos, CA care about them and are praying for them. Or you can put your name on a paintbrush as we will be painting City Hall at street level. You can also help sponsor one of our youth. We ask each participant to pay for part of their trip. They pay \$400.00. In actuality the cost to send one person last year was \$600.00. We are still calculating the cost this year but don't expect it to be less than last year. Please stop by the table in the church entrance the weekend of May 20/21 to sign your name on a rock or paintbrush and leave a donation. Donation envelopes are currently available on the counter above the bulletins.
