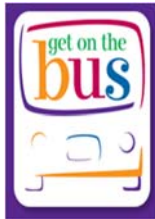
**SECOND COLLECTION:**

#### **“FOR I WAS IN PRISON AND YOU VISITED ME.”**

**(Matthew 25:36):** Last Saturday children with their mothers (or chaperones) and **Get on the Bus** volunteers went to the two prisons in Soledad for a Fathers Day visit. I was in a visiting room with 21 inmates and their families and I want to tell you that God was there! It was amazing to see families together laughing, eating, playing board games, and enjoying their time together. I saw several things that reminded me that God was there: I witnessed a wedding between an inmate and his fiancée and child. A minister came into the prison to perform the ceremony. I witnessed a family saying grace before eating their lunch. I saw God present in the smiles of each family member as they spent time together. God was also present in the care and concern of each volunteer as they served. As I was getting ready to leave the visiting room the inmates and many family members shook our hands to thank us for being there. Some of them couldn't believe that we would willingly come into the prison. Just as we were preparing to walk through the gate to leave the porter (one of the inmates who is assigned to provide us with what we need and to help with the clean up during the day) prayed over us to thank us for giving of our time and bless us as we traveled home. ### **LET'S END MODERN SLAVERY!**

Did you know that you can help reduce human slavery by purchasing products labeled "Fair Trade"? This is how we support the companies that sell us our food and other products who ensure that no human slavery was used in their supply and production chain. Yes, these items usually cost more, but that is because they are not being produced using slave or under-compensated labor.)



The US State Department estimates that 21 million men, women and children are being held in some kind of forced labor—modern slavery. (Other human rights groups put the number at 35 million.) These are some of the people who harvest our food, make our clothes, gather the raw materials made for electronics, jewelry and makeup, or who are sold for "adult pleasure". They are not only in far-off places, but right here in the Monterey Bay region. What can we do? First of all, educate ourselves. ## SAINTS OF THE WEEK

**June 19: St. Romuald, Abbot.** Ever been to the New Camaldoli Hermitage in Big Sur? You have St. Romuald to thank, for he is the founder of the Camaldolese Order. Born in 950, Romuald entered a Benedictine monastery at age 20. He desired to combine a hermit's life with missionary preaching. This he did in Hungary until illness forced him to return to a monastery. He went on to establish several monasteries from which he modified the Rule of St. Benedict to allow for a more contemplative and austere life. His "Brief Rule" is a spiritual gem (see below).

### St. Romuald's Brief Rule

*Sit in your cell as in paradise. Put the whole world behind you and forget it. Watch your thoughts like a good fisherman watching for fish.*

*The path you must follow is in the Psalms; never leave it. If you have just come to the monastery, and in spite your good will you cannot accomplish what you want, then take every opportunity to sing the Psalms in your heart and to understand them in your mind.*

*And if your mind wanders as you read, do not give up; hurry back and apply your mind to the words once more.*

*Realize above all that you are in God's presence, and stand there with the attitude of one who stands before the emperor.*

*Empty yourself completely and sit waiting, content with the grace of God, like the chick who tastes nothing and eats nothing but what his mother gives him.*

**June 21: St. Aloysius Gonzaga, Jesuit.** He was one of the original followers of St. Ignatius, founder of the Jesuits. Aloysius joined the Jesuits at age 18, and was drawn to study, education of youth and service to the poor and suffering. He went to Rome to care for victims of the plague and died at age 23.. When he was canonized in 1726, he was declared patron of Catholic youth.

**June 22 – St. Thomas More, Martyr.** Popularized in the book and film, *A Man for All Seasons*, Thomas More was a husband, father of four children, scholar, lawyer and chancellor of England under Henry VIII. His siding with the pope against Henry's divorce and remarriage cost him his life in this world, but gained for him eternal life.

**St. John Fisher, Bishop & Martyr.** John was a good priest and bishop, unpretentious and modest, genuinely concerned for the poor and seeking the reform of the Church. He was also killed for refusing to accept Henry's remarriage. **St. Paulinus of Nola, Bishop.** Born around 354, Paulinus was a contemporary of Sts. Ambrose, Augustine and Jerome. He became a respected lawyer and public official in Gaul and Italy. He from public office in his early 30's to the estate of his Spanish wife, Theresia, to study music and poetry. At age 35 he was baptized and gave much of his wealth to the poor and the needy. Eventually he was ordained to the priesthood, with his wife's consent, and turned to a life of solitude and prayer. After his wife's death, he was chosen to be bishop of Nola, Italy and served for about 21 years, during the difficult time of the Visigoth invasions.
