THE MASS NEVER ENDS—IT MUST BE LIVED!

We are invited to continue to reflect upon the Gospel reading, The Transfiguration of the Lord, (Matthew 17:1-9) and homily as we live out our Eucharist this week. Reflect upon it in your heart and mind, and discuss it with your family, friends and faith community members.

- From a mountaintop we can see things clearly and get perspective. What spiritual “mountaintop” experiences have you had, and how did they help you to see things more clearly?
- How do you listen to Jesus? What is he saying to you at this time in your life?
- Are you ever afraid of God? Why? How does it affect you for Jesus to say, “Do not be afraid?”

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, and in today’s Gospel reading we hear it proclaimed that on Mount Tabor, Peter, James, and John caught a glimpse of Jesus’ divinity strong enough to strike fear into their hearts. The event took place shortly after Peter’s confession of faith that Jesus was, indeed, the Messiah. In today’s second reading from Peter, we hear his personal testimony. This comes from a man who spent more than three years with Jesus. Peter witnessed his humanity. He saw Jesus hungry, tired, and finally, rejected and crucified. But he also saw Jesus feed the 5,000, walk on water, heal the sick, and raise the dead. He saw Jesus in his glory when he was transfigured. He saw Jesus risen from the dead and ascend into heaven with the promise that he is coming again in power and glory. How strong is the stewardship of our own faith? Do we accept Peter’s apostolic witness to Jesus as Christ? Does this testimony help us acknowledge and trust Christ Jesus as our Lord and savior?

SHOWERS FOR HOMELESS PROGRAM

is much closer to a successful reality! In June, the Mid-County Coalition of Churches for Homeless Showers (MCCCHS) had \$17k on account, mostly from the Chili Cook-Offs. Last month's fund-raising effort targeted additional \$3k to reach a targeted total of \$20k; enough to buy the towable mobile shower unit. That weekend, Resurrection parishioners contributed \$2,620.00, and more trickled in recently from St. Andrews and other sources bringing the total above \$2,800!!! Kudos to all of you for your thoughtful support. The end result is that the MCCCHS has ordered the showers trailer, and it will be ready for pick-up (best case) in late September after construction is completed. As mentioned at the June presentation, the trailer will be placed on display at Resurrection (as at other churches, too) for all to see, touch, smell, and perhaps get a little wet. LET'S END MODERN SLAVERY!

Did you know that you can help reduce human slavery by purchasing products labeled "Fair Trade"? This is how we support the companies that sell us our food and other products who ensure that no human slavery was used in their supply and production chain. Yes, these items usually cost more, but that is because they are not being produced using slave or under-compensated labor.) The US State Department estimates that 21 million men, women and children are being held in some kind of forced labor—modern slavery. (Other human rights groups put the number at 35 million.) These are some of the people who harvest our food, make our clothes, gather the raw materials made for electronics, jewelry and makeup, or who are sold for "adult pleasure". They are not only in far-off places, but right here in the Monterey Bay region. What can we do? First of all, educate ourselves.
