MARKEY COMMUNITY CENTER PROJECT UPDATE

Project Cost Reduced by \$800,000!

In an effort to reduce the cost of the project, our architect & builder have applied VALUE ENGINEERING which has resulted in a cost estimate of \$5.7 Million, down from the original estimate of \$6.5 Million. This has been done by reducing some of the expansion into the far side breezeway (which eliminated an expensive engineering modification), and a few other changes, but the basic layout is still the same. A huge thanks to our building team!

It is essential for everyone to appreciate that nearly half the cost of the project is simply to make the 55-year old building safe and accessible:

- ⇒ Significant structural engineering has to be done to make the building safer in earthquakes.
- ⇒ The building must have fire sprinklers installed to help protect it from fire.
- ⇒ The kitchen must be brought up to code for public health safety (and it could also be shut down by the county health department if it isn't).
- ⇒ The building and bathrooms must be made ADA accessible.
- ⇒ The overall layout of the offices must be changed to make it a safer place to work and to gather.



The other half of the cost is to expand our square footage to accommodate our vibrant and vital Youth Ministry, our Faith Formation classes for children, and to provide improved space and facilities for outreach and other ministries and gatherings.

In a nutshell, half of the cost of the project is to save the building that we have, and the other half is to expand and modify it to meet our current and future needs. In other words, we've worn it out and have outgrown it!

We still need many volunteers to add to our fundraising team.
