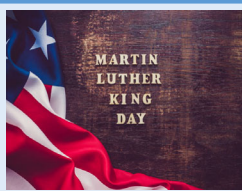

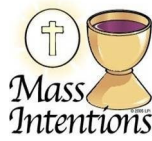


- The miracle was a sign that caused the friends of Jesus to believe in him? What are some events or people in your life that have helped you to have faith?

OUTREACH

THE ASSOCIATION OF FAITH COMMUNITIES (AFC)
 Several years ago Resurrection joined with other faith communities in the county to form the AFC to address the needs of our sisters and brothers without homes. AFC currently runs three programs: the Faith Community Shelter—a nightly rotating shelter that provides a warm bed, a meal and support to those experiencing homelessness, Safe Spaces—a safe parking program that allows those sleeping in their vehicles a place to sleep soundly, and a mobile shower program that provides a hot shower to those living in camps and shelters. FUNDS TO HOUSE THE HOMELESS AVAILABLE!

Housing vouchers are available for those without homes, and our Association of Faith Communities (our shelter organization) is looking for rental units to house people currently in our shelter and Safe Spaces (parking) programs. If you have a rental unit available, the AFC will refer our best candidates to you for consideration. The County Housing Authority will pay the rent at market value, and is currently offering a \$2,000 bonus to most landlords who rent to individuals with a voucher. Also, Landlords can be reimbursed up to \$5000 for damages that exceed the security deposit, unpaid rent, vacancy loss or legal fees. Landlords have the benefit of direct deposit, a landlord portal, a single point of contact (a Leasing Specialist), and the security of knowing that the rent will be paid, even if a tenant's income decreases. The properties eligible must not be a room in your house

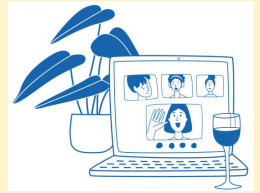


Save the Date! Resurrection Church 2022 February "Fun"draiser

A Reflection by Erma Coty

Here we go again! Seems like the virus is again dominating the news, our conversations, and our daily lives. Or trying to. What to do, what to do, what to do?

Each of us will react in our own way to another potential disruption in our lives related to the course of the pandemic. We will either discover our reserve of strength and move forward or perhaps feel overwhelmed by helplessness. Some will experience the stages of grief, others may look for “alternative” answers for a scientific problem that is puzzling the most experienced epidemiologists.

I hope (there’s that word again) that I will be able to “keep calm and carry on”. I must admit that the carry on part gets more difficult whenever there is a setback. And, it is clear that each of us reacts differently. My concerns are much different than those of young adults, or parents of young children. I do rely on those tools that have helped my “soldier on” in the past. This week it is the words of wisdom of others that provide support for me; in fact, they help me stay positive for others as well.

- (Isaiah 40:31) But those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength. They shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.”

Clearly, we can turn to the Bible for encouragement and support. I think the imagery in this passage is remarkable when I need to find the strength to move forward. I even have my choice of help in keeping me moving. Imagine hitching a ride with an eagle or sprinting forward and not running out of energy! Just the images make me hopeful.

- (Martin Luther King) “We must accept finite disappointment but never lose infinite hope.”

Indeed, MLK is an example of pushing forward despite the many barriers that he faced. And he still inspires us to continue to hope despite setbacks in life’s journey.

- (Pope Francis) “Never yield to discouragement, do not lose trust, do not allow your hope to be extinguished.”

I find that hopeful words from Pope Francis help me feel like I am connected to hope generated by the whole church. Thank you Papa!

- (Bob Marley) “You never know how strong you are, until being strong is your only choice.”

Yes, Bob Marley. And, yes, because of the challenges we face with this relentless virus, we need to stay strong. Some of us need to stay stronger in order to help lift a friend or family member. Often we need the strength of others to keep our own balance.
