Middle School & High School Youth Ministry:

In light of the current circumstances due the Coronavirus we will not be running our Middle School and High School Youth Group programs through December. We will re-evaluate the situation at that time.

Youth Confirmation:

Confirmation is open to all High School Youth, beginning in 9th Grade. It is a two-year program. **In light of the current circumstances due the Coronavirus all Juniors and Seniors will enter as 2nd year participants and will only be required to complete one year.**

- *At this time, participants will only be required to attend one Confirmation meeting a month.* Confirmation 1st year 2nd year will meet separately.
- The requirements for Confirmation 1st & 2nd year will be adjusted as needed due to the Coronavirus. (These could include youth group meetings, retreats, special events, volunteer and community service activities for the parish and larger community).
- This year due to Covid and the uncertainty that retreats and special events can take place, we are adjusting the price for confirmation from \$225 to \$100. In the event that any of these activities can take place we will collect the fees at that time.
- Registration forms are available on our website under Youth Ministry in the Resource Center.
- **Please be sure to register before the first session of Confirmation 2nd Year (October 10) & Confirmation 1st Year (October 24)**

OUTREACH

FAITH COMMUNITY SHELTER: Starting in November, the Faith Community Shelter will be returning to Resurrection. Once again, the parish will be providing dinner, safe overnight shelter and a take-away breakfast bag for approximately 15 people every Tuesday night. Right now, we are in need of more helpers.

What is the commitment if you are possibly interested? You would be assigned to one of our wonderful food teams and, approximately once every 6 weeks, you would bring a dish for the dinner (e.g., salad, dessert, main dish, etc.) or breakfast bags for the morning. It is up to each group to decide on their menu, so this varies every week.

In the past, food team members have served our guests, then joined them to share the meal. However, at the moment, everyone can decide for themselves if they are comfortable with this format or if they prefer to drop off their dish at the door. All shelter guests have been fully vaccinated, but safety is the program's highest goal! We realize that many people may have health conditions or have family members at home who are immunocompromised, so we want all of our volunteers to feel safe. FOOD PANTRY: Our Food Pantry serves the needs of the poorest of our community each Monday and Friday morning from 10:00 AM to noon. Thanks to being an official distribution center for the Second Harvest Food Bank, and your generous donations, we have plenty of food to offer those who need it. Throughout the pandemic we haven't had to purchase any food from Second Harvest. All food from Second Harvest has been given to us free. We are so grateful for our generous volunteers who come each week to serve the clients and to make the food bags and keep everything organized. Truly Christ is revealed in the breaking of the bread!

FUNDS TO HOUSE THE HOMELESS AVAILABLE!

300 new housing vouchers available for those without homes, and our Association of Faith Communities (our shelter organization) is looking for rental units to house People currently in our shelter and Safe Spaces (parking) programs. If you have rental unit available, the AFC will refer our best candidates to you for consideration. The County Housing Authority will pay the rent at market value, and is currently offering a \$2,000 bonus to most landlords who rent to individuals with a voucher. Also, Landlords can be reimbursed up to \$5000 for damages that exceed the security deposit, unpaid rent, vacancy loss or legal fees.

Landlords have the benefit of direct deposit, a landlord portal, a single point of contact- the Leasing Specialist, and the security of knowing that the rent will be paid, even if a tenants income decreases.

The properties eligible must not be a room in your house but an area with a separate entrance and bath/cooking areas.

Senior Resource Ministry

A Reflection by Erma Coty

Have you ever had the kind of a week where you became aware of sort of related bits of information that attracted your attention? You know what I mean. A word will remind you of a thought which is connected to a news bite, and so on. You might be thinking I am a bit out of my mind right now. But perhaps I can explain.

I was watching as an interviewer asked someone if they had any regrets, if there were moments that they would change. This is a classic interview question. Frankly, the interviewee responded in a predictable way, "No, I learned from each choice I made, da dum da dum da dum!" The answer was unremarkable, though I expect the intention was to be inspirational.

However hearing the word "regret" reminded me of the words of Mark Twain: "We regret the things we don't do more than the things we do." Nothing new here either. Except that the word *regret* was stuck in my head and led me to think of what I might still want to do.

And that, of course started me thinking about what I might want to do compared to what I am still able to do. All of us may have obstacles that limit some of our choices. After a certain age many of us believe we can no longer have new adventures. For each individual that age is different. Or perhaps we have limited resources, either physical or financial, or spiritual.

For instance, today William Shatner, age 90, announced he would be going to space on the strange looking space ship, Blue Origin. Shatner, AKA Captain Kirk from Star Trek, will try just about anything. He seems to have the right resources, the desire to make the brief journey, and the new space technology provides the opportunity.

The Rolling Stones keep touring, even as they approach their 80th birthdays. Bruce Springsteen does fewer 4 hour shows, a concession to the aging E Street Band. Age does not present a barrier to their desire to perform.

Jimmy Carter just celebrated his 97th birthday. He didn't spend time regretting a lost election. He did not stop serving when he left the White House. It might be said that he had just begun a full life of service. He worked toward world peace and fair elections for years. At the same time, he taught Sunday School at his church. And he worked with Habitat for Humanity, building homes.

Pope Francis leads an active life at 84, continuing to serve the poor and live a simple life rather than one of lavish luxury. His humble service sets an example for all of us.

So, I began by hearing the word regret. And the word led me to consider, not past regrets, but future possibilities.
