UPCOMING EVENTS

"FUNDING THE MISSION" SECOND COLLECTION:

Beginning this weekend, October 26 & 27, we will have a monthly second collection for the support of our parish ministries. **100% of this collection will be used for parish needs.** Our Finance Council has discerned that this is necessary to sustain our parish mission "to grow in Christ and to accept the challenges of loving service." The \$16,300 budget deficit in the past fiscal year (2018-2019) is evidence that regular weekly collections and fundraisers alone are no longer sufficient to sustain our parish ministries and the fulfillment of our mission as Church. The annual financial report will be coming soon which will detail this more clearly. As members of the Body of Christ and of the Parish Family of Resurrection, we are all responsible for carrying out the mission that Christ has given us to "make disciples of all the nations," each one of according to our gifts and calling. Let us recommit to supporting our part of the Church and its mission here at Resurrection through our generous giving.

MARKEY COMMUNITY CENTER REMODEL UPDATE:

We have successfully acquired a building permit from the County and are continuing to raise the money needed for the project by approaching major donors. When this phase of the fundraising is completed, we will reach out to everyone in the parish. The Diocese will start lending us money for the project once we have raised the full amount in pledges and gifts. Please keep praying for the success of the project!

We are invited to continue to reflect upon the Gospel reading (Luke 18:9-14) and homily as we live out our Eucharist this week. Reflect upon it in your heart and mind, and discuss it with your family, friends and faith community members.



- If you found yourself at Heaven’s gate and St. Peter asked, “Why should I let you in?” what would you say to him? (What does this parable suggest?)
- Ok, what kinds of other sinners do you catch yourself looking down upon? And what is your “righteousness” that you feel good about? (What does this parable say about that?)
- What sins of your past or present haunt you? Do you believe that God will forgive you and “justify” you if you repent and ask for mercy? (What does this parable say?)
