You'll be able to see and hear everything, but we won't be able to hear you if you want to share a prayer intention or peace greeting (but God will hear you!)

From a smart phone or tablet:

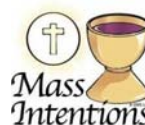

RACISM & THE DEATH PENALTY: Do Black Lives Matter in a World with Capital Punishment?

We explore the role of racism in critical aspects of death penalty cases. What role does racism play in death penalty prosecution? What role does a defendant's race play in the decision to seek the death penalty? What role does a victim's race play in seeking the death penalty? We ask, "in the world of death penalty prosecution, do Black Lives Matter?"

How are jurors selected in death penalty cases, and how does race influence who serves as a juror in a capital case?

SHELTER UPDATE: Our round-the-clock shelter continues to operate smoothly in Markey Community Center. Our little "family" of 17 beautiful people are able to shelter-in-place thanks to the gift of our center. They spend their time quietly reading, doing puzzles, keeping everything spotless, watching TV and movies, and enjoying our beautiful grounds in the lovely spring weather. During the shelter-in-place order, meals are being brought in by local caterers and restaurants, and we thank them for this wonderful, compassionate service! Shelter staff are onsite 12 hours each day to provide support, and one of the guests serves as the overnight monitor. Our mobile shower unit is on-site three days a week, and we thank our faithful and brave volunteers for providing this service. Our guests are so very grateful for our hospitality and want you to know it! Thank you for your ongoing support of the parish which makes it possible for us to be of service to others!

"SAFE SPACES" PARKING HOSPITALITY Some people without homes live in their vehicles, whether they be cars or vans or RV's. Resurrection has joined with other faith communities and organizations in Santa Cruz County to provide safe and supervised overnight parking for some of these brother and sisters. The program is managed by the Association of Faith Communities, of which Resurrection is a founding member, and which also manages our shelter program. We currently have two guests staying in their camper vans at night, safe and secure. We had electrical outlets installed in two of our lamp posts to provide power for our guests. A Reflection by Erma Coty

We have had to make some tough decisions this year. In fact, even our simplest decisions come under our personal scrutiny, such as what time will I venture out to get groceries or will it be possible to safely go to the dentist. So I started thinking about the decision making process.

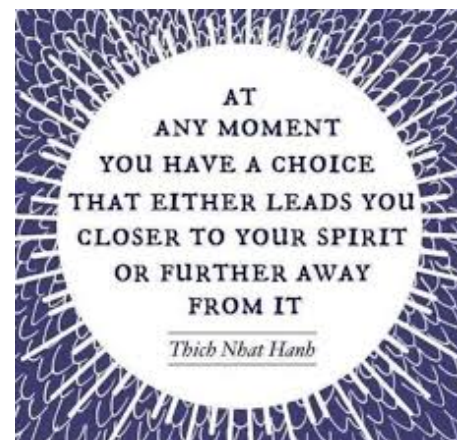
Some folks are very deliberate in their decisions, arduously debating with themselves and with the available information to help them reach a conclusion. And then there are those who rely on instinct and intuition without consulting facts or friends to assist in their decision. Some decisions are made with thought and consideration resulting in the best decision possible with the information available. And I think that is how most people actually manage daily decisions. At least they did before COVID-19 became a confounder. Now, we all need to take an extra moment to decide how COVID might have an adverse impact on the choices we make. Can we afford to be impulsive? Will unnecessary delays have unintended negative consequences? Considering COVID in our decision process is now embedded into our daily lives. It is likely that we will begin to notice less and less how the effect of this deadly disease has changed our lives. We will be living in a new normal. I must admit that many of the outcomes might have been reasonably implemented before this pandemic.

For instance, we probably don't need to shake hands as a greeting. It is unlikely that we meet folks on a daily basis who we might suspect are carrying a weapon. In fact a handshake might give a left-handed aggressor an unfair advantage (never mind those who are ambidextrous). Shaking hands and hugging as a sign of peace during Mass is an example of a practice that might need to be reconsidered. For some cultures, a firm handshake is a sign of strength or confidence. For others, not so much. And in some European countries a handshake is accompanied by air kisses or other close encounters. Alternatively, a shunned handshake can substitute for turning your back on someone in order to clearly demonstrate your dislike or disdain for that individuals. At Mass it is a greeting of peace. We did not always include this practice. Should we reassess the risk versus the benefits of its inclusion in the Mass?

This topic alone could instigate hours of discussion with people taking sides and presenting passionate arguments that support either keeping or abandoning the practice. Yet, individuals have always chosen how they would participate in sharing a sign of peace without any controversy at all.

What seems clear to me is that we all will be making decisions over the next few years to determine how we can personally manage our decision making so that we will demonstrate "loving our neighbor as ourselves". How will we adapt to necessary changes in how we conduct our daily lives? What changes may be necessary to assure safe worship while still encouraging fellowship? What compromises will be necessary as we blend our new normal with our past habits and routines?

Our futures may depend on our willingness to be good stewards of the earth, on being generous members of humanity and on understanding the impact of our individual decisions.
