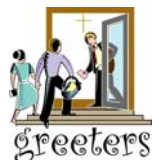
EUCCHARISTIC MINISTERS NEEDED:

STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah we get a glimpse of a model for Christian stewards to follow. Within the temple, God's voice shakes the foundations and causes the natural world to shake and tremble. The Lord asks: "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" Isaiah replies to the call of God for service with immediacy and enthusiasm: "Here I am, send me!" There is no hesitation. There are no excuses, contingencies, or "what-ifs." Good stewards know that responding to the Lord's call to serve is never easy, never simple to grasp, never designed for ready comfort and success. But the call needs a response. What about us? What does it take to shake us into an enthusiastic response? To say to God: "Here I am, Lord. Send me!"

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR FAITH COMMUNITY

SHELTER: We are looking for 2 volunteers to work at the new St. John's Helpful Shop in the retail space near Manuel's Restaurant. Volunteers are needed at various times/days Monday through Saturday, 1:00-4:00 PM. The AFC will split profits with St. John's in the proportion to which we provide volunteers during regular shop hours. Currently, the AFC needs to raise about \$70,000 per year for the shelter's operational expenses; for our usual 18 guests, this is \$10.65 per person per night. Volunteers would wait on customers and provide other light-duty help as needed. No previous experience is necessary - training will be provided. LET'S END MODERN SLAVERY!

Did you know that you can help reduce human slavery by purchasing products labeled "Fair Trade"? This is how we support the companies that sell us our food and other products who ensure that no human slavery was used in their supply and production chain. Yes, these items usually cost more, but that is because they are not being produced using slave or under-compensated labor.)

The US State Department estimates that 21 million men, women and children are being held in some kind of forced labor—modern slavery. (Other human rights groups put the number at 35 million.)

These are some of the people who harvest our food, make our clothes, gather the raw materials made for electronics, jewelry and makeup, or who are sold for "adult pleasure". They are not only in far-off places, but right here in the Monterey Bay region. What can we do? First of all, educate ourselves. SAINTS OF THE WEEK

February 10: *St. Scholastica, Virgin.* Scholastica (480-547) was the twin sister and great spiritual friend of St. Benedict, the developer of Christian monasticism. With Benedict's help, she established a monastery for women a few miles from his.

February 11: *Our Lady of Lourdes.* Most of us are familiar with the story of how Mary appeared to young Bernadette Soubeyrou at Lourdes in 1850 (Popularized by the classic film *Song of Bernadette*, starring Jennifer O'Neal and Vincent Price—check it out!). At Mary's direction, Bernadette uncovered a spring of water which flows to this day, and with which thousands of people have been physically and spiritually healed by the power of God.

February 12: *Abraham Lincoln.* While neither Catholic nor canonized, history reveals that Abraham was guided by God's Word to take a courageous stand for justice and human dignity. A man of his times in many other ways, he was a prophetic voice and leader for our nation in gaining the beginning of freedom for hundreds of thousands of African Americans. Someone once said that Abraham was a good president because he knew that Jesus was the real president.

February 14: *St. Cyril, Monk and St. Methodius, Bishop.* These were brothers who served as missionaries to the Slavic people in the 9th century. They translated the scriptures and liturgy into the native language of the people and developed the written language still used today. They suffered persecution from some leaders of the Church in Rome for doing this, but God vindicated them and has given them a place of honor in the Church. We too must be bold and take risks to bring the good news of Jesus and God's love wherever and however it is needed.

Please be sure to lock your cars and do not leave valuable items in sight in your cars when you come to church.
