## **THE MASS NEVER ENDS—IT MUST BE LIVED!**

We are invited to continue to reflect upon the Gospel reading (John 21:1-19) and homily as we live out our Eucharist this week. Reflect upon it in your heart and mind, and discuss it with your family, friends and faith community members.

- Jesus addresses the disciples as “children.” Meditate for a few moments with Jesus addressing you lovingly as “My Child.” What kinds of thoughts and feelings come up for you?
- Jesus gives Peter three opportunities to express his love for him, perhaps because Peter had denied Jesus three times. When do you have opportunities to verbally express your love for those whom you love?
- Who are the people in your life that Jesus is giving you to love, to “shepherd”? How do you “feed” them?

## Reflection by Erma Coty

I watched Hoda interview Prince Harry at the Invictus Games last month. They were discussing the positive impact of the games as well as future special events that the royal family had coming up. Hoda, being a skilled interviewer asked Harry about the “rest” of the time, the ordinary time when holidays are past and no special days are on the near horizon. Hoda commented that for ordinary folks most days were “just Wednesday”. I’d never thought about the middle of the week as being “just Wednesday”, nothing special.

At this moment in time, I look forward to days that are “just Wednesday”. I like boring and quiet. As an older adult I expect more days that are filled with “a little of this and a little of that” and with few major commitments. I imagine myself in a rocker with a cup of wild-flower tea and my latest needlework project. In my mind I am wearing a frilly cap and full apron (circa 19<sup>th</sup> century) as well. My imagination knows no bounds! Of course, my old fashioned scene does not exclude modern conveniences such as my microwave oven, icemaker, and entertainment center.

In reality, “just Wednesdays” are usually made up of a variety of medical appointments, unforeseen car emergencies, and newly discovered leaky faucets that were fine on Tuesday. For a prince, management of household emergencies is likely to be an experience that reflects the ordinary days in the lives of ordinary people. On any given day, we can expect our lives to be interrupted by unexpected events, good and not so good. Our ordinary days are more infrequent than we might like. **FACT: Life is just life.**

The days that followed the Resurrection can be described as just Wednesday. The apostles went on with their lives. They had conversations with each other and when Jesus joined them they did not recognize Him. The Apostles would not have been expecting to see Jesus so their brain might not have recognized Him. They were likely still shocked and confused by the crucifixion and the disappearance of Jesus from the tomb.

The Apostles may have hoped they could resume their familiar routines when Jesus would accompany them on any given day. Ordinary days fishing or visiting friends. We know that God had other plans. Just as he does with us. We make plans, God laughs.
