"I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." - John 14:6

"I am the Way and the Truth and the Life"

"What is truth?" asked Pontius Pilate when Jesus told him that he came to "testify to the truth." Pilate, as a worldly, educated man, was familiar with all the philosophical debates about truth.

The debates still go on, don't they? What is the truth, and whom should we believe? What should we do, and whom should we follow? Which choices will bring us safety and well-being?

At the Last Supper, the night before his conversation with Pilate, Jesus assured his questioning apostles that all they needed to was him—to know him, to love him, and to follow him. It may be cliché, but it is true: "Jesus is the answer!"

Jesus is the Way. We often ask, "Which way do we go?" Jesus shows us the way, through his teachings, through his example, and through his Spirit each day. But also, as he tells Thomas, "I am the way." Jesus is inviting us, yet again, to join ourselves to him, not just following him, but being with him and in him and he in us.

Jesus is the Truth. We are cautious about what we believe, for good reason! There are many lies, many falsehoods abounding in our world. But Jesus promises us that he, through his Spirit living in us, will guide us to all truth. And he himself is Truth. In him we can rest secure, knowing that there is no falsehood in him. He is right and true!

Jesus is the Life. Sometimes when we are content, we say, "Ah! This is the life!" When we are content in the Lord, resting in him, then we can say that in the ultimate way. Jesus is God, and God is Life itself—"I AM who AM". All the riches and comforts in the world cannot satisfy us more deeply than living in our Risen Lord Jesus!

Due to the pandemic we have been sending out multiple emails to our parish list every week to keep everyone connected. If you have not been receiving our “What’s Happening” or any other parish-wide communications please make sure you send us an email to resurrectionparish@sbcglobal.net so you can be added.

Recently we have been updating our parish list to make sure that our parishioners are receiving all important parish notices as well as reflections, liturgy and worship aids.

As part of this update, we noticed that several parishioners have either “unsubscribed”, marked their email as “do not contact” or in some cases we do not have an email listed for a parishioner. If you were told in the past that we can’t add you back if you accidentally marked “Do Not Contact” - we now have instructions for you to follow to re-subscribe. Send us an email and we will send you the instructions. We want to make sure that you stay connected to the parish!



COVERED CALIFORNIA SPECIAL ENROLLMENT PERIOD FOR STATE SUBSIDY OR PENALTY: For the 2020 benefit year, a new, short-term qualifying life event (QLE) will allow certain consumers to enroll through a special enrollment period (SEP) from **February 18 through April 30, 2020. This date has been extended to June 30, 2020.** This Special Enrollment is due to COVID-19. Covered California doesn't care if you have been exposed or not. The goal is to simply get coverage to as many people as possible. Consumers unaware of the state penalty, the new financial help, or who currently insured off-exchange and want to switch to Covered California to benefit from the new state subsidies will be able to apply for Covered California. Those currently **uninsured** should contact www.Coveredca.com or our Service Center **(800) 300-1506** to enroll. For **insured** Consumers looking to move to Covered CA they should contact their current Certified Insurance Agent to walk them through the process and facilitate the change. For people who have lost jobs and employer sponsored group plans, Covered CA is also an option.
