*"Do not be afraid of those who kill the body...be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." –Matthew 10:28*

### "Fear No One"

Fear no one? Really?

It's very tempting to dismiss these words as being completely out of touch with reality (there are many dangerous and evil people to fear, aren't there?). But since Jesus says them to us, we'd better find out what he means!

Far from being unrealistic, Jesus is the only one who truly understands reality. He knows things, he sees things that we can't possibly understand. And he knows that we can't understand what he knows, so he has to ask us to simply trust him.

When he tells us to fear no one, he means that when we are living with him day by day, doing his will, and serving his kingdom, then we are living in his grace and are protected by his power. This is as good as life gets!

But does this mean that no one will ever hurt us, or that bad things will never happen to us? Of course not. Matthew tells us that Jesus spoke these words to "The Twelve", and ten of these men were martyred for proclaiming the Good News (John died in old age and Judas killed himself). And Jesus, even though he was God, suffered most of all.

Jesus was preparing The Twelve for the persecutions, sufferings and death that they would experience. He was telling them not to be afraid **when** these things happen: "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body."

How in the world can we not be afraid of the death of our bodies, whether it be through natural death, injury, or harm?

By having faith in Jesus. Faith that he will be with us through the suffering and death, and faith that he will lead through these things to eternal happiness, where all sorrow and pain will be forgotten.

Without faith in Jesus, we are lost, driven by fears and desires, imprisoned in our own minds. Jesus comes to set us free from all these things. He's removed our chains and opened the door and invites us to step out into freedom, the true freedom of living with him forever.

Have a little faith!

### WELCOME BACK TO MASS!

This weekend (June 20/21) we resume our four regular weekend masses for the first time in three months! It will be great to see many of you again! Due to social distancing requirements we have very limited seating, and reservations are required. (A letter and an email explaining all the requirements was sent to all parishioners June 12. If you didn't get it, you can read it [here](#).) We have also resumed our Tuesday through Friday daily masses at 8:30 am. Thank you for your patience, prayers, and amazing support as we continue to safely adapt to living with the COVID-19 virus. The Bishop has suspended the Sunday mass obligation indefinitely since many people still need to stay at home, and we will continue to live stream our 8:30 AM weekday and our 10:15 AM Sunday mass.

### "LIVE FROM RESURRECTION! IT'S SUNDAY MORNING!"

Our live stream Sunday mass will be at **10:15 AM** as we resume our regular weekend mass schedule.

Anytime after 10 AM on Sunday, here's how to join us:

#### Option 1: YouTube (non-interactive)

Go to our YouTube channel (<https://www.youtube.com/channel/UC-OOaTsxpSPs60Qlt0CIKQ>) (or simply search YouTube for Resurrection Church, Aptos) and look for the "Live Now" video. You'll be able to see and hear everything, but we won't be able to hear you if you want to share a prayer intention or peace greeting (but God will hear you!)

#### Option 2: Zoom (interactive)

##### From a computer:

##### From a smart phone or tablet:

1. Download the Zoom app (if you don't already have it)
2. Start the app and select "Join a Meeting"

1. Dial 1-669-900-6833 (a San Jose number)
2. Enter Meeting ID 429 472 279 and #
3. (Enter # again (no "Participant ID" needed)

An email will be sent on Saturdays with a convenient one-click link for computer users and a link to a worship aid for all. A link will also be placed on our website. A Zoom Visual Aid is available on our website.

You may wish to have a trial run by logging on ahead of time. If you get to a page that says "This meeting has not started" then you've succeeded!

Because of my age and health condition (Type I Diabetes), I am at high risk of serious complications if I become infected with the COVID-19 virus. Consequently, my physician has advised me not to resume public ministry until there is data on the consequences of opening up; and I am in agreement with him. For now, I will continue some form of sheltering in place.

I sincerely miss worshipping with you at Resurrection. Please keep me in your prayers, and I will certainly continue to pray for you. I look forward to the day when we can gather and pray in person.

They spend their time quietly reading, doing puzzles, keeping everything spotless, watching TV and movies, and enjoying our beautiful grounds in the lovely spring weather. During the shelter-in-place order, meals are being brought in by local caterers and restaurants, and we thank them for this wonderful, compassionate service! Shelter staff are onsite 12 hours each day to provide support, and one of the guests serves as the overnight monitor. Our mobile shower unit is on-site three days a week, and we thank our faithful and brave volunteers for providing this service. Our guests are so very grateful for our hospitality and want you to know it! Thank you for your ongoing support of the parish which makes it possible for us to be of service to others!

**FOOD PANTRY IS OPEN!** Our Food Pantry also continues to serve the needs of the poorest of our community each Monday and Friday morning from 10:00 AM to noon. Thanks to being an official distribution center for the Second Harvest Food Bank, we have plenty of food to offer those who need it. We are able to purchase what we need from the Food Bank at a fraction of retail cost thanks to your generous donations, and we receive many free things from the Food Bank as well. 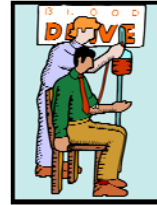
