## UPCOMING EVENTS

**MISSION APPEAL THIS WEEKEND:** August 10/11. This weekend we welcome Fr. Thaddeus Kuusah from the Archdiocese of Tamale, Ghana. The Archdiocese has a population of about 974,909 and is very rural. A larger percentage of people who are over 6 years of age have never been to school. Female education is very low. There is a high rate of illiteracy in the Archdiocese. Illiteracy affects the development of the Archdiocese in all spheres. There is a low access to education facilities in rural areas. The Archdiocese of Tamale can contribute greatly in solving this problem if we can establish schools in the places where we minister. Though Islam remains the dominant religion (approximately 85%), Christianity has made great inroads, especially in rural areas. The Archdiocese intends to open three more parishes in the East Gonja & Kpandai districts, bringing the total to five. Aside from bringing the word of God to the people in these places it will also offer the Church the opportunity to bring education to these people. In order to do these things we need some basic infrastructure such as catechists' houses and presbyteries in order to start these parishes and continue our work of evangelization. Youth formation and vocation promotion remain key issues in the Archdiocese of Tamale as well. We need support also for the training of seminarians, priests and other pastoral agents. Thank you for your generosity.

**GOSPEL MOMENT FOR REFLECTION**

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus concludes his teaching about those who are "faithful and prudent stewards" with that classic stewardship teaching: "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more." Christian stewards recognize that God is the ultimate source of

their gifts, talents, resources and aptitudes, and that God wants them to use these varied gifts in his service. This week might be a good time to reflect on our God-given gifts. Are we using those gifts to serve the Lord? If Christ came back to us unexpectedly tomorrow would we be able to

give a full accounting of how we have exercised stewardship over these gifts?

For many years we have been doing our best to help them through our Parish Assistance Ministry, but some people need special help in getting their lives back together.

Deacon Patrick works with the person, but needs your help to provide for material and financial needs. If you're on our parish email list, you've received his "Help Needed!" emails about particular individuals in need, and you're always incredibly generous in responding. In addition to responding to Deacon Patrick's emails, you can also support the Lazarus ministry by making a donation to the parish designated for the Lazarus ministry.
