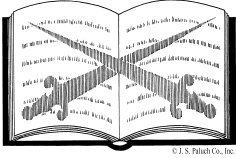

UPCOMING EVENTS

2018 DISASTERS EMERGENCY COLLECTION: Bishop Wilkerson has called for an emergency second collection throughout the Diocese of Monterey to assist with the humanitarian, long-term recovery and Church needs arising from the devastating impact of Hurricanes Florence and Michael, and all 2018 disasters. His call comes at the request of the President of the USCCB, Daniel Cardinal DiNardo, in a September 24 letter to all bishops:



“The funds collected in this special appeal for 2018 Disasters will be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities USA and/or Catholic Relief Services, the official relief agencies of the US Catholic Church, as they and their local agencies respond to immediate emergency needs for such necessities as water, food, shelter, and medical care and aid in long-term rebuilding and recovery efforts, and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops for pastoral and reconstruction needs of the Church. Funds will be used in response to Hurricane Florence and any other natural disasters that occur this year.” **The collection will be taken up here at Resurrection this weekend, October 13 & 14.**

LET'S END MODERN SLAVERY!

Did you know that you can help reduce human slavery by purchasing products labeled "Fair Trade"? This is how we support the companies that sell us our food and other products who ensure that no human slavery was used in their supply and production chain. Yes, these items usually cost more, but that is because they are not being produced using slave or under-compensated labor.)

The US State Department estimates that 21 million men, women and children are being held in some kind of forced labor—modern slavery. (Other human rights groups put the number at 35 million.) These are some of the people who harvest our food, make our clothes, gather the raw materials made for electronics, jewelry and makeup, or who are sold for "adult pleasure". They are not only in far-off places, but right here in the Monterey Bay region. What can we do? First of all, educate ourselves.
