## THE MASS NEVER ENDS—IT MUST BE LIVED!

We are invited to continue to reflect upon the Gospel reading (John 13:31-35) and homily as we live out our Eucharist this week. Reflect upon it in your heart and mind, and discuss it with your family, friends and faith community members.

- Think of a time when you were impressed by how people really loved one another. How could you tell that they loved one another? How did that encounter make you feel about yourself and your own life and relationships?
- Jesus basically seems to be saying that true Christianity and all its moral and theological precepts boil down to this: that we really love one another as Jesus has loved us. Our “practice of the faith” is really about our relationships with other people – do we love them as Jesus loves us? Jesus calls this “a new commandment.” Is this perspective on our practice of religion new to you? Is following this “new commandment” your primary focus as you set out to live each day and your standard of evaluating the successes and failures of each day lived? How would your life be different if it were?
- There are many things that go by the name of “love,” but in this gospel Jesus is defining love as how he has loved us. If we want to know what real love is, we have to see and experience how Jesus loves us. How has Jesus loved you? Based on this love of Jesus, what is love?

# MISSION SUPPORT FOR THE ARCHDIOCESE OF TORORO UGANDA

The Archdiocese of Tororo, covering an approximate area of 8,500 square miles, serves an estimated population of 3.6 million people, about 1.2 million of whom are Catholic. These are some of our needs.

**1) Parishes:** caring for 45 parishes 984 missions or sub-parishes

## 2) Formation of pastoral ministers

• Currently we have about 315 seminarians, about a quarter of whom will proceed on to the major seminary. We have about 40 seminarians studying in the philosophical and theological seminaries.

• We currently have 117 native diocesan priests and 9 religious priests. Once ordained, our priests need to continue their formation, especially by attending educational workshops and spiritual retreats.

The 945 catechists serve the mission churches (sub-parishes).

**3) Transportation of pastoral ministers:** The priests and catechists need to travel to and from the mission churches, usually scooters and bicycles.

**4) Education:** In collaboration with the Government of Uganda, the Archdiocese runs several Primary, Secondary and Technical schools. Most of these schools, run by our 16 native religious brothers and 243 native religious sisters, are in rural settings where there is no electricity, no computers and not enough textbooks and laboratory equipment. The teaching and learning process becomes very difficult in such an environment.

**5) Health:** The Archdiocese has one hospital, three sub-hospitals and twelve small medical facilities through which we try to fulfill Christ's ministry of physical healing. These facilities, usually run by the religious sisters are not funded by the Government and must depend on user fees to purchase drugs and equipment and cover the cost of personnel.

**6) Economic development:** The Archdiocese of Tororo, through its development arm CARITAS, empowers the laity with skills that can improve their economic base. 69% of the people are peasant farmers with small plots of land on which to cultivate their crops. Because of this, most of them live from hand to mouth, which has an adverse impact on their income. Through CARITAS-Tororo, the Archdiocese runs programs, especially in the area of improved agricultural methods, so that families can sustain themselves better economically.

**7) Women:** Archdiocesan Women's Desk focuses on the realities of women. When empowered, women can do a great deal to improve their families' economic situation as well as the sanitary condition of their homes.

**8) Water:** Our Five-Year Strategic Plan includes a program to increase access to clean, safe water. Presently only 72% of our people have access to improved water sources; the rest have to rely on unprotected springs and wells.

## “SEASONED” FINALE

Location: All Saints Day School, 8060 Carmel Valley Road, Carmel-by-the Sea, CA 93923

Our season finale for this most unusual year features three flavorful pieces with stylistic variety. The concert appetizer is Gustav Holst’s Fugal Concerto, featuring two of your favorite principal soloists, Oboist Peter Lemberg and Flutist Lars Johannesson, accompanied by a string ensemble. This is one of Holst’s most enjoyable compositions so don’t let the work “fugal” scare you. For dessert: a piece by living American composer Clark McAllister called Lou’s Mountain Bread, which is an ingenious arrangement of American folk tunes (including Skip to My Lu and She’ll be Comin’ Round the Mountain – hence the title) as you have never heard them before. The main course is Beethoven’s Septet for Winds and String, a magnificent 40-minute work in Beethoven’s early style harkening back to the best of Mozart and Haydn. This piece was Beethoven’s single most popular composition during his lifetime, so much so that it was responsible for starting an entire genre of large ensemble music from his time to today.
