WELCOME BACK TO CHURCH INDOORS!

We have **two masses each weekend indoors:**
Saturday at 5:00 PM & Sunday at 10:15 AM.

Due to social distancing requirements we have limited seating, and reservations are required. **To reserve a seat for weekend masses please [click here](#).**

- **Please arrive at least 10 minutes early for screening. Surgical masks or 2-ply cloth masks with a bendable nose band are required for everyone. Two masks recommended. Contactless temperatures will be taken.**
- **If you are unvaccinated & have been exposed to someone with COVID you must quarantine for 10 days before coming to church.**
- **If you have been fully vaccinated and are exposed to a COVID-19 positive person you do not have to quarantine; however this only applies if no more than 3 months have elapsed since the date of your last (or single) shot.**
- **If you are unvaccinated you should quarantine for 10 days if you have traveled out of state, but it is not required. If you are vaccinated this is not necessary.**

You’ll be able to see and hear everything, but we won’t be able to hear you if you want to share a prayer intention or peace greeting (but God will hear you!)

Option 2: Zoom (interactive)

2. Enter your name (so we’ll know you’re there!)

From a smart phone or tablet:

1. Download the Zoom app (if you don’t already have it)
2. Start the app and select “Join a Meeting”

1. Dial 1-669-900-6833 (a San Jose number)
2. Enter Meeting ID 429 472 279 and #
3. (Enter # again (no “Participant ID” needed))

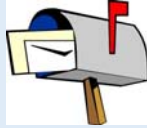

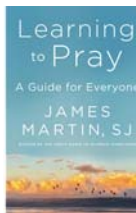

Your weekly offering helps pay for 70% of our operating expenses, expenses which continue even during the shutdown. Our staff is still working for you "behind the scenes". We thank you for your patience and for your continued support of the parish!

FOOD PANTRY: Our Food Pantry continues to serve the needs of the poorest of our community each Monday and Friday morning from 10:00 AM to noon. Thanks to being an official distribution center for the Second Harvest Food Bank, and your generous donations, we have plenty of food to offer those who need it. We are able to purchase what we need from the Food Bank at a fraction of retail cost thanks to your generous donations, and we receive many free things from the Food Bank as well. We are so grateful for our generous volunteers who come each week to serve the clients and to make the food bags and keep everything organized. Truly Christ is revealed in the breaking of the bread!

"SAFE SPACES" PARKING HOSPITALITY Some people without homes live in their vehicles, whether they be cars or vans or RV's. Resurrection has joined with other faith communities and organizations in Santa Cruz County to provide safe and supervised overnight parking for some of these brother and sisters. The program is managed by the Association of Faith Communities, of which Resurrection is a founding member, and which also manages our shelter program. We currently have six guests staying in their RV's at night, safe and secure. We had electrical outlets installed in two of our lamp posts to provide power for our guests. Please keep them in your prayers!

SHELTER PROGRAM: Our round-the-clock shelter relocated to the VFW Hall in Live Oak last Tuesday after 13 months here at Resurrection. It was sad to see them go! They have been a wonderful presence in Markey Center and in our lives. Over this time there have been two shelters operated by our Faith Communities Shelter, a program of the Association of Faith Communities (AFC), which Resurrection helped to start many years ago. The other shelter has been hosted by Santa Cruz Methodist Church. Both shelters are now combined at the VFW to simplify management and costs. Thank you for your prayers and support for this life-saving ministry! Here's a beautiful thank you poem written by one of the guests:

Thank you!

*To Everyone at Resurrection Church:
We write this "Thank You" letter
Because our lives got better
By you opening up your door
To the homeless and the poor.
We know we're not the best
Or even perfect guests
And yet you made us feel
As if we were*

SHELTER SUCCESS STORIES!

Thanks to the stability provided by our round-the-clock shelter over the past 13 months, 40 of our guests have been able to work and save up enough money to move into their own homes. Here are some of their stories:

Grace and Brian— They were with us for a bit over a year and fell in love while each of them was recuperating from a serious medical condition. Through a volunteer from one of the churches, they were able to move into her home - from there, they were able to save money and recently moved into their own place.

Robyn— A long-term member of the shelter and a real leader in the group. She saved money from an in-home health care job and was able to move into a shared housing situation, paying her own rent.

Krystal and Connor—This mom and her adorable -year-old son were able to get into the Rebele Family Shelter and she is working diligently with her case manager to find her own housing.

Songhai came to our program through another shelter member. Within four months, he found a good job, saved money and was able to move out to his own place. There are many others who have passed through our shelter since COVID began and we are proud of their efforts. In fact, the number of people we have helped move to employment and/or better housing has gone up dramatically. We think it is largely due to the stability of having a place to call "home" during these stressful COVID times, as well as the extra time that Debbie Bates, program manager of the Faith Community Shelter, and her staff have to spend working on housing plans with each of them.

RESURRECTION CARD-CRAFTERS: Father's Day is June 20 and our card crafting group will be selling cards after the 5:00 PM mass in the parking lot on June 5, 12, & 19. There are also a wide array of hand-made cards available, such as general summer cards, Birthday, New Baby, Thinking of You, Thank You, Sympathy, Congratulations, and Wedding Wishes designs. As always, materials are donated, so all of the profits from card sales go to support the Faith Community Shelter at Resurrection.

A Reflection by Erma Coty

I can hardly believe that June has arrived bringing with it morning fog and afternoon sunshine. I visited a nursery and brought home plants for my vegetable garden. Naturally, I was tempted to buy everything I saw. Luckily, good sense won out. I reminded myself to buy plants that can successfully grow in my garden space; to buy plants that produced vegetables I would gladly prepare for meals and could be shared or frozen; and, to choose plants that could be grown successfully in a drought.

Living in an agricultural mecca is certainly a blessing. I learned over the years to understand that growing food (or flowers and plants) is not easy. Whenever I drive south on Hwy. 1, I say a prayer of gratitude for those who work so hard to make sure we enjoy fresh vegetables and berries. And I am grateful that my garden plot is so small.

We often take for granted the availability of fresh food. I was raised in Southern Nevada, a hot dry desert. I had no idea how food ended up on shelves at our local grocery stores. Fresh produce was truly seasonal and finding any unusual or specialty foods was unlikely. We did have small Italian delis that offered expensive Italian hams and salami as well as baskets of baccala (salted, dried cod). Fruit and vegetable availability were dependent on the season and appropriate food transport.

When I was small, the orange groves growing near Disneyland were as much a fascination as any ride at the park for a youngster who only saw fruit on the produce aisle of the local market. Today we can visit grocery stores and specialty shops to find many of the exotic ingredients we see on the food channel. Fragile tropical fruits are available country wide. What can't be purchased locally can be ordered online and may arrive the next day. I wonder if anyone is still in awe of agricultural fields or if easy available produce is taken for granted.

I heard on the news this morning that a major meat distributor was the victim of a cyberattack. Cyber security is now one more consideration for food producers. I have one more reason to be grateful for those who overcome barriers of all kinds to provide us with food for our tables.

June is here. We are slowly adjusting to our new normal lifestyle that will include continued precautions such as indoor mask use, social distancing, frequent handwashing and grateful awareness. I know that I will never drive past a field without prayerful thanks for all those who work hard to assure the availability of our food supply.

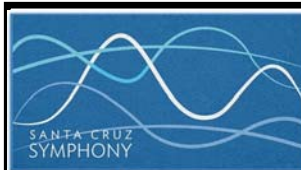
SANTA CRUZ SHAKESPEARE

The season which will run from July 20 through August 29 includes

William Shakespeare's "Troilus & Cressida"
