We are invited to continue to reflect upon the Gospel reading (Luke 10:25-37) and homily as we live out our Eucharist this week. Reflect upon it in your heart and mind, and discuss it with your family, friends and faith community members.

- When was a time that you were "moved with compassion" to help someone in need? When was a time that you "passed by?" How do you feel about each experience now?
- The Jews looked down upon the Samaritans as people who neither knew nor did God's will. That is why it was shocking for Jesus to portray the Samaritan as the only one who did God's will. Who are the people whom you think are the least likely to do God's will, and why do you think that about them? How might you be wrong about them?
- Who is your "neighbor," and how can you "go and do likewise?"

NEW PARTNER FOR SPIN (SOCKS FOR PEOPLE IN NEED): The SPIN program, which has been collecting/distributing new socks to people in need around the Santa Cruz area for more than 6 years, has a new partner – Hopes Closet of Santa Cruz County. Hopes Closet is an all-volunteer nonprofit organization which assists children in need by providing new and gently used baby, toddler and youth clothing, shoes, books and toys to children and families in need. The Closet works directly with local schools and more than 25 social service agencies (such as Head Start, Child Protective Services, Foster Families, Salud Para La Gente, and the Center for Farm Worker Families, to name just a few). As of June 15th, SPIN has donated a total of 34,255 pairs of new socks.
