You’ll be able to see and hear everything, but we won’t be able to hear you if you want to share a prayer intention or peace greeting (but God will hear you!)

Reopening of California

What do I need to know to attend mass?

- Reservations are no longer required to attend weekend masses.
- The dispensation from the Sunday Obligation will remain in place at this time. This is subject to change later this summer by Bishop Garcia.
- "For fully vaccinated individuals a face mask is not required. For unvaccinated individuals, a face mask is required indoors."
- You are welcome to continue wearing a mask if you are not comfortable going without.
- The daily mass chapel will be reserved for people who are wearing masks and are not comfortable being around unmasked people yet. Thank you for your cooperation.
- Social Distancing is no longer required.
- Singing is allowed.
- Hand sanitizing stations will remain. Entering and exiting the church will remain the same. We will no longer be taking temperatures.
- We will continue with daily mass being held in the main body of the church.
- Weekday Mass Schedule: Tuesday through Friday at **8:30 am** in person and live streamed. Holy Hour & Benediction on Fridays after mass.
- Weekend Mass Schedule: Saturday at 5:00 pm in person; Sunday at 10:15 am in person and live streamed.

FOOD PANTRY: Our Food Pantry continues to serve the needs of the poorest of our community each Monday and Friday morning from 10:00 AM to noon. Thanks to being an official distribution center for the Second Harvest Food Bank, and your generous donations, we have plenty of food to offer those who need it. We are able to purchase what we need from the Food Bank at a fraction of retail cost thanks to your generous donations, and we receive many free things from the Food Bank as well. Through the pandemic we haven't had to purchase any food from Second Harvest. All food from Second Harvest has been given to us free. We are so grateful for our generous volunteers who come each week to serve the clients and to make the food bags and keep everything organized. Truly Christ is revealed in the breaking of the bread!

"SAFE SPACES" PARKING HOSPITALITY Some people without homes live in their vehicles, whether they be cars or vans or RV's. Resurrection has joined with other faith communities and organizations in Santa Cruz County to provide safe and supervised overnight parking for some of these brother and sisters. The program is managed by the Association of Faith Communities, of which Resurrection is a founding member, and which also manages our shelter program. We currently have six guests staying in their RV's at night, safe and secure. We had electrical outlets installed in two of our lamp posts to provide power for our guests. Please keep them in your prayers!

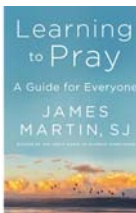

JOHN'S HELPFUL SHOP: Have you ever thought it might be fun to work in a thrift shop for a couple of hours each week? Or even once a month? If so, you may be interested in this unique

volunteer opportunity: St. John's Helpful Shop, which moved about 3 years ago from Capitola Village (where it had been located for 65 years) to the Seacliff Beach Area (246A Center Ave., across and down a block from Manuel's Restaurant) and is in need of helpers. No experience is necessary and training will be provided. Volunteers wait on customers, stock shelves, and provide other light-duty help as needed. The shop is operated by our neighbor, St. John's Episcopal Church. At the end of the year, they will split their profits (in proportion to which our volunteers participate) with the Association of Faith Communities (AFC) which operates the Faith Community Shelter project (which Resurrection has participated in for the past five years) all money received will directly support the shelter. If you have a friend who is interested, but not a member of the parish, that's certainly fine; men are very welcome to help, too! A Reflection by Erma Coty

Randy Travis sang a song called “Forever and Ever” that had the words “As long as old men sit and talk about the weather”. I am not an old man (though I could probably (likely) be considered an *old* woman), but I am going to take a moment to talk about the weather. Specifically the weather in Santa Cruz County.

In my neighborhood, we seem to be experiencing temperatures that range from 48°F to over 100°F over the course of a week or so. Some of the week we have familiar temperate weather that demands dressing in layers but is neither too hot nor too cold. Most of us are used to wearing long sleeves or putting on a sweater when we are cold. But all too often we have no idea how to keep cool in extreme heat. And since we are approaching another heat wave I think it’s a good time to go over some of the best ways to *beat the heat*.

Extreme heat can be dangerous for everyone. In areas like Las Vegas folks plan activities for early morning or late day and evening with this in mind. Many activities are moved indoors. Little League is played at night to keep children and spectators from the hazards of the sun.

But, even with precautions those who are older, have health problems, or are very young are especially vulnerable. So here we go again. I will start with ways to avoid overheating.

If possible stay out of the sun during the hottest times of the day. Find a cool spot (shopping center, library, or senior center) with air-conditioning. Thank goodness we now can be out and about.

If you need to go outside wear a hat. Remember to apply sunscreen. And don’t forget to apply it to your head if you have thinning hair.

Remember to drink fluids. Water is best. Avoid alcohol and caffeine.

Avoid overexertion. Even housework may be too much unless you have AC.

Remember to contact friends and older family members to make sure they are staying cool and hydrated.

Find out if you are on any medications that might affect how your body reacts to the heat. Poor hydration can cause changes in how you are feeling, or how you are behaving or thinking so be aware of all changes during hot weather. Stay safe and dress in layers.
