COPA (Communities Organized for Relational Power in Action) was founded in 2003 by Resurrection and several other faith communities of Santa Cruz and Monterey Counties. We'll be gathering on Sunday, September 30 at Sherwood Hall in Salinas at 3:00 PM for a special anniversary celebration, and everyone is invited! If you've always wondered what COPA is, this is a great opportunity to come and see!



COPA is a regional nonprofit organization spanning Monterey, Santa Cruz and San Benito Counties, made up

of 22 member institutions of churches, synagogues, public schools, labor organizations and nonprofits.

It has a Lead Organizer, two youth organizers, and one administrative assistant. The organization is driven by 200 active leaders with an ability to mobilize 500 to 5,000 leaders. Issue strategy teams of leaders from the member institutions guide the organizing work. COPA's mission is to develop the leadership skills of ordinary people to engage effectively in public life with power to negotiate with public and private sector leaders to change the economic, social, political and cultural pressures on their families.

- Jesus says that the evil in the world that hurts people comes from within people. When you read his list of inner evils, which ones do you recognize in you?

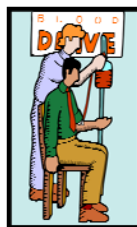
## **ROSARY GROUPS:**

**CARD-CRAFTING CIRCLE:** Resurrection's CARD CRAFTING CIRCLE is looking for additional volunteers. We meet once every 3-4 weeks to make cards – for holidays and other celebrations, plus general interest cards (such as sympathy, get well, etc.). About once a month, we sell them after the weekend Masses at Resurrection, with all profits going to support the Faith Community Shelter (which the parish welcomes on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month).

So far, the Card-Crafting Circle has been able to purchase 20 sleeping mats and pillows for our shelter guests, plus pay for supplies to build the 2 large storage units where the mats are kept. Over the next 6 months, our profits will go toward purchasing bus passes that will enable shelter members get to medical appointments, job interviews, or to other shelter locations.

All supplies are provided, and no special talent is required. The Card Crafting Circle is a great opportunity to have fun, socialize with other parishioners, and do something important – helping to raise much-needed funds for our Faith Community Shelter ministry. 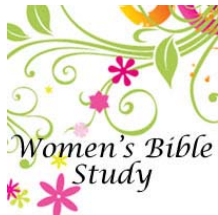

As the Church of Monterey continues to grow, our needs for the ministry of service continue to grow by leaps and bounds. The Deacon's ministry is threefold: to the service of **Charity/Justice**; service of the **Word**; and service of the **Liturgy**.

To learn more about the life and ministry of a Deacon in the Church, there will be information sessions held around the diocese (dates, times, locations listed below). They are offered for those who want to explore a possible call to this ordained ministry. It is recommended that married men who are interested also bring their wives with them as it is her journey of discernment as well.
