BIBLICAL SPIRITUALITY

How do we live out the Word of God that we proclaim at mass each Sunday? Join with other disciples to share the scripture readings for the upcoming Sunday each Thursday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM in the Daily Mass Chapel. We'll explore the contexts of the readings, how the Church understands them, and reflect upon how we can be influenced and guided by them. Let by Deacon Patrick Conway. BIBLE STUDIES WITH ELIZABETH KNAPP

This fall two Bible studies will be available to those seeking to know and understand scripture better. On Wednesday mornings a Beginner's Bible Study will be offered for the beginner to intermediate Bible student. For the intermediate to experienced student an in-depth scripture study will be presented on Thursday mornings.



The **Beginners Bible Study** will begin a yearlong study on the Gospels seeking to know better the Word who became flesh. This study is designed for those new to scripture study and those seeking to strengthen their understanding of the period of Jesus' ministry. This study will draw us closer to Jesus as we study events, parables, and stories from his life that will help us to answer the question Jesus once posed to Peter, "Who do you say I am?" We will focus on building a personal relationship with our Savior as we ponder another question Jesus asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" We will explore what it means to have a personal relationship with Jesus and how that can help us to always have an answer for our faith. Class begins Wednesday, September 18 from 9:30-11:30. We will meet Wednesdays through November 13, take a break for the winter holidays, and start up again February 12 and conclude April 22.

The Thursday morning **Women's Bible Study** class will begin a yearlong study of *A Woman's Heart: God's Dwelling Place*. This in-depth study explores the fascinating Old Testament account of the building of the tabernacle, the significance of its design, its role in God's eternal plan, and the grand fulfillment of its purpose by Jesus Christ. This study will be grounded in the Old Testament book of Exodus and the New Testament book of Hebrews as scripture comes together to reveal God's dwelling place in our heart. Class begins Thursday, September 19 from 9:30-11:30. We will meet on Thursday mornings through November 14, take a break for the winter holidays and start up again on February 6 and will conclude May 7.

GOSPEL MOMENT FOR REFLECTION

In Jesus' parable of the Unjust Steward, we encounter a financial manager who has wasted his master's wealth and faces dismissal from his position. To overcome the crisis confronting him, the steward reduces some very considerable debts owed by poor neighbors to his master in order to help them out. Though the steward has sinned against God and his master by squandering what belongs to someone else, both the prudent way in which he goes about resolving the crisis coupled with relieving people who are in need can be seen as a way to better steward the gifts entrusted to us by God. Although good stewards today acknowledge that they may never use their God-given gifts in a way that completely conforms to the demands of the Gospel, a commitment to using their gifts with prudence and for the purpose of helping their neighbors wins God's favor.
