Pope Francis in the News August 2023

Pope Francis is writing a second part of Laudato Si' which should be published by October 4th. The Director of the Holy

See Press Office says the second part of the Laudato Si' encyclical letter which Pope Francis will focus on the recent climate crises. Pope Francis said the second part of his Laudato Si' encyclical will update it to reflect current conditions. The document addresses issues such as climate change, care for the environment, and the defense of human life and dignity.

"We must never forget that the younger generations have the right to receive a beautiful and livable world from us, and that this implies that we have a grave responsibility towards creation which we have received from the generous hands of God," said the Pope.

In other news from the Vatican, Pope Francis emphasized that Jesus is a living and relevant figure in our lives. The Pope said, "we are not alone on the path of life, because Christ is with us and Christ helps us to walk, as he did with Peter and the other disciples."

"Let us not be discouraged if at times the summit of the Christian life seems too high and the path too steep," he added.. "Let us look to Jesus — look to Jesus always — look to Jesus who walks beside us, who welcomes our frailties, shares our efforts and rests his firm and gentle arm on our weak shoulders. With him close at hand, let us also reach out to one another and renew our trust: with Jesus, what seems impossible on our own, with Jesus we can go forward."
