

THE SYNOD

THE SYNOD – COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION, MISSION

This past Wednesday, on the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, Pope Francis convened the Universal Phase of the Synod



on Synodality in Vatican City. The Synod process started in October of 2021 with the "listening" phase as Catholics around the world gathered in our parishes to reflect on the blessing of the Church in people's lives and on how the Church might be called to grow in service and mission. These reflections have been summarized into a document that is now being studied and discussed at the Universal Synod in Rome by 294 bishops and 70 other male and female delegates (lay people, clergy, and religious) appointed by Pope Francis from around the world.

There are three overarching questions for the universal synod assembly:

1. How can we be more fully a sign and instrument of union with God and of the unity of all humanity?

2. How can we better share gifts and tasks in the service of the Gospel?

3. What processes, structures, and institutions are needed in a missionary synodal Church?

The assembly will adjourn on October 29th, then reconvene next October to formulate recommendations to Pope Francis regarding the three questions above. Pope Francis will then decide what to do about the recommendations.

The current Synod on Synodality is the 16th Synod of Bishops convened by popes since synodal meetings

were established by the Second Vatican Council to continue the powerful collegiality experienced at the Council. Unlike Church councils, which, in union with the Pope, can make binding decisions and declarations, a synod is a consultative body to help popes discern the way forward with various issues and needs.




Ensemble Monterey Intense Quintets

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

War, whether it be in Ukraine or in the Middle East is terrible. It is heart wrenching for the people living in these respective locations, but also for family and friends who care about those who live there.

Today, Tuesday, October 17, Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, Archbishop Latin Primate of Jerusalem, called for us to join him in praying for Peace and Reconciliation in the Holy Land. We spiritually accompany him in prayer, not only today, but also in the days ahead. The terrible massacre of Israeli children, women, and men (young and old) on Saturday, October 7th (*Our Lady of the Rosary*) was unthinkable and horrific. Now, hostages are being held. There is no excuse for this kind of violence and hate, regardless of what country or people. Every act of violence and hate begets more violence and hate!

How many times have I cried out upon hearing of such an atrocity, "When will we learn, O Lord?" Amidst, these difficult days, it is easy to become cynical and disengaged when this War seems to be so distant from us here in the United States. Regardless of national origin, these are our brothers and sisters!

Cardinal Pizzaballa has urged Catholics to organize times of praying with Eucharistic Adoration and recitation of the Rosary, "to deliver to God the Father our thirst for peace, justice and reconciliation." He also said, "In this time of sorrow and dismay, we do not want to remain helpless. We cannot let death and its sting (1 Cor 15-55) be the only word we hear." "That is why we feel the need to pray, to turn our hearts to God the Father. Only in his way we can draw the strength and serenity needed to endure these hard times, by turning to him, in prayer and intercession, to implore and cry out to God amidst this anguish."

As this war progresses, just as in Ukraine, let us be mindful of the humanitarian crisis that is growing exponentially every day. Innocent civilians, whether they be of Israeli or Palestinian descent are caught up in the middle of these acts of terror and destruction. There are NO winners!

Let us not forget to pray also for emergency and humanitarian workers: those who are assisting victims of this violence, who are in need of food, water, health care, and shelter. May our Lady of Peace intercede for all of us during this difficult time!
