

THE SYNOD

THE SYNOD – COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION,

MISSION: On the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi (October 4), Pope Francis convened the Universal Phase of the Synod on Synodality in Vatican City. The Synod process started in October of 2021 with the "listening" phase as Catholics around the world gathered in our parishes to reflect on the blessing of the Church in people's lives and on how the Church might be called to grow in

service and mission. These reflections have been summarized into a document that is now being studied and discussed at the Universal Synod in Rome by 294 bishops and 70 other male and female delegates (lay people,



clergy, and religious) appointed by Pope Francis from around the world.

There are three overarching questions for the universal synod assembly:

1. How can we be more fully a sign and instrument of union with God and of the unity of all humanity?

2. How can we better share gifts and tasks in the service of the Gospel?

3. What processes, structures, and institutions are needed in a missionary synodal Church?

The assembly will adjourn on October 29th, then reconvene next October to formulate recommendations to Pope Francis regarding the three questions above. Pope Francis will then decide what to do about the recommendations.

The current Synod on Synodality is the 16th Synod of Bishops convened by popes since synodal meetings were established by the Second Vatican Council to continue the powerful collegiality experienced at the Council. Unlike Church councils, which, in union with the Pope, can make binding decisions and declarations, a synod is a consultative body to help popes discern the way forward with various issues and needs.



Halloween evolved from the Celtic celebration of Samhain. The ancient Celts of Britain and Ireland believed that during this time of year the souls of the dead returned to visit their homes. The use of pumpkins and Jack-o-lanterns, costumes and trick or treating originated in America. Most people are reminded of the Celtic origin story only when they watch The Legend of Sleepy Hollow or read the history of King Arthur. Costumes were worn so the dead could not recognize the living.



Dia de los Muertos, the Mexican Dav of the Dead, is also a time when families honor ancestors who have died. Families celebrate their loved ones by creating temporary altars (called ofrenda) dedicated to those departed relatives. They decorate the altar with flowers, butterflies and skulls that surround photographs of those who are dead. The orange marigold is the flower of choice since its musky fragrance is thought to lead the souls back to their homes.





Both holidays are dedicated to honoring the lives of family and friends who have died. The feast of All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation honoring those deemed to have lived exemplary lives.
