THE SYNOD

THE SYNOD - COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION.

MISSION: On the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi (October 4), Pope Francis convened the Universal Phase of the Synod on Synodality in Vatican City. The Synod process started in October of 2021 with the "listening"

phase as Catholics around the world gathered in our parishes to reflect on the blessing of the Church in people's lives and on how the Church might be called to grow in service and mission. These reflections were summa-

rized into a document that was studied and discussed in October at the Universal Synod in Rome by 294 bishops

and 70 other women and men (lay people, clergy, and religious) appointed by Pope Francis from around the world.

The Synod assembly has published a summary report of their discussions (read it HERE). They will reconvene next October to resume their discussions and to make recommendations for Pope Francis to consider.

ORPHANS: Abject poverty, pollution, and cartel activities obscure the natural beauty of tropical Honduras. In 1996, a young Catholic couple, Vincent and Zulena Pescatore, began an orphanage to provide a home with love, safety, and healing to abused and abandoned children roaming alone on the streets there. This home, Farm of the Child

(the "Finca"), added a school, medical clinic, and chapel for Finca children as well as for hundreds of other impoverished people who have built mud or concrete homes in the surrounding mountains to share in these services. Three Franciscan



Sisters serve these children together with hundreds of lay missionaries over the years. In addition to religious services, the vivacious Franciscans add love, music, reading, sports, and emotional and spiritual support for the children.

Belatedly, I appreciate and thank all of you who generously donated soccer cleats and socks which I was able to deliver to the Finca when I volunteered there this Summer. Richard McAdams was particularly helpful in securing numerous pairs of cleats from Play It Again Sports. Upon receiving these cool and colorful cleats, the children lit up as if Santa had just come. For many of the children, the gift received at Sister Rosa's Christmas party is the only one they will get for Christmas. Many of the parents were out of work due to COVID-19 so Christmas won't happen unless we help Sister Rosa make it happen for those children.

Columbia Sportswear has made a wonderful assortment of new children's jackets available in all different styles, colors, and sizes for the Knights to purchase at 50% below their regular wholesale cost, at \$25-30 each, including freight. These same jackets sell in the stores for \$70-\$80.

This year, three Anonymous Donors have contributed \$9,000.00 in cash to the Knights with the understanding that it must be matched, or the money returned. We must not let that happen since Sister Rosa is counting on us.
