Responsorial Psalm 130: With the Lord there is mercy, and fullness of redemption!

Gospel Refrain: I am the Resurrection, I am the Life! All who believe in me shall live!

The Third Scrutiny:

After homily, Fr. Romeo introduces the scrutiny.

On this Fifth Sunday of Lent, we join with our RCIA elect in taking a closer look at ourselves. Let us pray silently for a moment, that all of us will be given a sense of sin, a spirit of repentance, and true freedom as children of God.

I now invite our elect to come forward with their sponsors.

Let us pray for these elect whom God has chosen. May the grace of the sacraments conform them to Christ in his passion and resurrection and enable them to triumph over the bitter fate of death.

Let us all ask ourselves:

• What are the things that keep us entombed?

Preparation of the Gifts: On Eagles Wings

- 1. You who dwell in the shelter of the Lord, who abide in his shadow for life, say to the Lord: 'My refuge, my rock in whom I trust!'
- *Refrain:* And he will raise you up on eagle's wings, bear you on the breath of dawn, make you to shine like the sun, and hold you in the palm of his hand.
