GATHERING: We focus our attention on the cross of Jesus Christ

PENITENTIAL ACT: Kyrie eleison, Christe eleison, Kyrie eleison

LITURGY OF THE WORD see **Readings**

Responsorial Psalm 95: If today you hear the voice of God harden not your hearts.

Gospel Refrain: All who drink the water I give will never thirst.

The water I give will be a fountain within you, giving life!

The First Scrutiny:

After homily, Fr. Romeo introduces the scrutiny.

On this Third Sunday of Lent, we join with our RCIA elect in taking a closer look at ourselves. Let us pray silently for a moment, that all of us will be given a sense of sin, a spirit of repentance, and true freedom as children of God. (*time of silent prayer*) I now invite our elect to come forward with their sponsors.

Let us pray for these elect whom the Church has chosen. May they successfully complete their long preparation and at the paschal feast find Christ in his sacraments.

Let us all ask ourselves:

- What personal or national shame do we hold that cries out for cleansing? Silent reflection (followed by sung refrain "All who drink...")
- How can we be part of the fountain of life that Jesus offers to others? Silent reflection (followed by sung refrain)
- Where do we find fountains of life that nurture us spiritually? Where do we go to find the strength that we need to live out the faith that we profess? *Silent reflection (followed by sung refrain)*

Exorcism

God of power,

you sent your Son to be our Savior.

Grant that these chosen ones,

who, like the woman of Samaria, thirst for living water,

may turn to the Lord as they hear his word

and acknowledge the sins and weaknesses that weigh them down.

Protect them from vain reliance on self and defend them from the power of Satan.

Free them from the spirit of deceit, so that, admitting the wrong they have done, they may attain purity of heart and advance on the way to salvation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. (Amen.)

Laying on of Hands

Let us pray:

Christ Jesus, we thirst for so many things: love, community, security, self-worth, wholeness, peace, dignity, friendship, and so much more.

In you we can find these things.

In you we can be made clean by the fountain of your love and compassion.

Come and lead us to your well of grace and mercy, so that we may never thirst again. Amen.

Prayer of the Faithful: You may un-mute and share your prayers.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

Preparation of the Gifts: The God of Second Chances

- 1. Come now, O God of second chances; open our lives to heal. Remove our hate, and melt our rage. Save us from ourselves.
- 2. Come now, O God, release our demons; open our eyes to see the shame within, our guilt and pain. Mend us; make us whole.
- 3. Come now, O God, and still our anger; open our minds to peace. Embrace our fear, and hold us close. Calm the storm within.
- 4. Come now, O God, shake our resentment; open our way to choose the way of love over revenge. Show us a new way.
- 5. Come now, O God, and grant compassion; open our hearts to love. May we let go of all our hurt. Help us to move on.
- 6. Come now, O God of second chances, may we forgive ourselves, may we become your living sign: Children of God's love.
