OUTREACH

CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME

We are working with other faith communities to learn how we can work together to make better choices and to advocate for better policies and practices in our region to reduce our human impact on climate



change. We can all be more conscious of how our individual, daily choices either increase greenhouse gases or reduce them. This can all seem overwhelming and hopeless at times. What difference can I make?

Pope Francis recently published a follow-up to his ground -breaking 2015 encyclical *Laudato Si*, *Laudato Deum* "Praise God". (Read *Laudato Deum* on our website <u>https://resurrection-aptos.org</u>, under Resource Center under Faith Formation.) In it Pope Francis reiterates the **moral imperative** for all Catholics and for all of humanity **to make choices** about what we drive, what we eat, what we wear, what goods we buy that lessen the effects of climate change, for the sake of the vulnerable now, and for the sake of generations to come.

Earth Care Actions. Each month, your Dayenu Interfaith Climate Action team will be encouraging you to take a few quick actions that will benefit our planet and future generations. Please note that these actions are being done across many faith organizations in Santa Cruz County, and you are part of a large interfaith effort! Here's how you can make a difference:

Anointing of the Sick I: The Mystery of Illness

We get hurt. We wear out. The lungs, the eyes, the memory, and any of the many limbs and organs that compose us break or ache. Gloom comes over us then: pity for ourselves, sorrow, depression, anger. But hope can come, too, and courage, and sometimes peace.

All of this is marked and celebrated in the rites of our tradition. With a word and a deed, with touch and breath and spit and mud, Jesus heals those who ail. In every place and time, we who are the church remember and tell stories of healing, anoint the sick with oil and share the one bread even with those who cannot assemble for Mass. Thus the sick and the healthy, the homebound and the spry, saints and sinners are made one and remain one, a single body of many parts.

Anyone who is seriously ill can be anointed, including the elderly who become weaker, even if no illness is present; those waiting for surgery when a serious condition is the reason for the operation; sick children who have sufficient use of reason to be helped by the celebration: and those who are unconscious or who have lost the use of reason, provided that they probably would have asked for the sacrament had they the use of their faculties. Furthermore, many forms of mental illness are now known to be serious. So the mentally ill may be anointed, provided that they will be helped and not harmed by the rite. If you have questions, consult a priest or other parish leader.

The most complete celebration of the sacrament is a communal one, a celebration in which those to be anointed are surrounded and supported by other members of the Christian community, whether at home, or in the house of the church (for those who can leave their beds and come here). In song and in silence, with scriptures and prayers, we strengthen the bonds of love and faith that are stronger than the most lethal disease and more powerful even than death.

Dear Friends:

I am writing to you today to give you an update on the Annual Ministries Appeal (AMA) and to request your participation. Many of you know that the AMA helps support the different ministries in the Diocese of Monterey. Though we may be in different parishes, we are all called to bear fruit with Jesus as the Cornerstone. Please take some time to contemplate how you can bring Christ to others. We at Resurrection, along with all the people of the Diocese, are enriched and blessed by the ministries supported by the AMA that help build up our faith communities.

The people of this parish have responded generously to past appeals, and I trust the same will happen this year even amidst the changing times that we are living in. As of April 22, we have reached our Diocesan goal of \$44,800.00. Ninety-six out of 1272 households have responded, \$45,712.00 has been pledged and we have met 54% of our goal. Your contribution will help us meet our goal of \$85,000.00.

All funds that we receive over the \$44,800.00 will be returned to our parish. The funds from our rebate this year will be used to repaint the exterior of the rectory & replace the flooring in the rectory (where our pastor lives), retrofit the church lights to LED, and help support our parish & ministries, and to help with ongoing maintenance costs. A gift to the AMA builds up both your parish and the diocesan Church. Last year your gifts allowed us to repaint the church and to replace the church windows.

We know that your financial situation may have changed so we want to be sensitive to your current situation but also want to reassure you that we are doing our best to manage our expenses and to be responsible for what you give to the parish.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the appeal last year. Please prayerfully consider making an **eight-month** pledge or a one-time gift to the 2024 AMA "Called to Bear Fruit with Jesus as the Cornerstone" for all the blessings you have received. We are asking **everyone to participate and donate** <u>any amount</u> that you can give. Every little bit helps and is appreciated. Sunday, April 28, 2024 Bearing Fruit

Today's readings: Acts 9:26–31; Psalm 22:26–27, 28, 30, 31–31; 1 John 3:18–24; John 15:1–8. "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing," Jesus tells his followers in today's Gospel. Jesus is the vine of life. The father is the one caring for the vine. As branches, we are capable of bearing fruit. In the first readings, we hear of Paul, who had once persecuted Christians, seeking a place with the disciples. Paul changed his ways and became a participant in the vine of life.

When Paul turned from his former way of life, he "spoke out boldly in the name of Jesus." After Paul's conversion experience, he sought to keep the commandments and remain in Jesus' love. Only by remaining in Jesus was Paul able to preach and bear fruit, for as the Gospel reading states, without Jesus, nothing can be done. How do you envision your connection to God the vine grower and to Jesus the vine? Is there anything in your life that you need God to prune so that you can bear more fruit? Ask Jesus to cut away that which impedes your growth in relationship to him. Reflect this week on what it means to remain in God. Do you consider that the good that you do is dependent on your relationship with God? When you stray from your connection with God, does the good that you do seem to falter?



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, April 29 Surrender

"Whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him," Jesus told the disciples at the Last Supper. From her youth, St. Catherine of Siena, whose memorial the Church celebrates today, portrayed her love for God through service. Not only did she minister to the poor, the sick, and the imprisoned, but she also confronted bishops and the pope and called for reforms in the Church. Today we ask St. Catherine of Siena to be our companion as we show our love for God through our work in the world. *Today's readings: Acts 14:5–18; Psalm 115:1–2, 3–4, 15–16; John 14:21–26.*

Tuesday, April 30 True Peace

Not long before inviting the faithful at Mass to offer one another a sign of peace, the priest says, "Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church." When the faithful offer one another a sign of peace, it is Christ's peace, not their individual peace. In today's Gospel, Jesus highlights the difference in the offerings of peace, saying, "Not as the world gives do I give it to you." Discussing your spiritual struggles during the sacrament of penance can bring one Christ's peace. Check your parish's schedule for the celebration of the sacrament of penance. *Today's readings: Acts 14:19–28; Psalm 145:10–11, 12–13ab, 21; John 14:27–31a.*

Wednesday, May 1 Faithful

Today we celebrate the optional Memorial of St. Joseph the Worker. Little is known about St. Joseph, but the few verses of Scripture that mention him show his obedience to God and the care he gave to Mary and Jesus. Pray that, like St. Joseph, you "bear much fruit" so that God is glorified. *Today's readings:* Acts 15:1–6; Psalm 122:1–2, 3–4ab, 4cd–5; John 15:1–8.

Thursday, May 2, 2024 A Universal Message

After telling the disciples to keep his commandments, Jesus explains, "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete." For many, obeying the commandments may seem burdensome, but Jesus reveals that doing so is the way to remain in Jesus' love and so is the path to joy. What does it mean for the Lord's joy to be in you? Have you ever considered that God finds joy in you? *Today's readings: Acts 15:7–21; Psalm 96:1–2a, 2b–3, 10; John 15:9–11.*

Friday, May 3 Feast of Sts. Philip and James

Today, on the Feast of Sts. Philip and James, Apostles, the Church honors two of the earliest followers of Jesus. At the beginning of John's Gospel, Jesus finds Philip and instructs him, "Follow me" (1:45). Philip wastes no time spreading the news of the messiah and encourages Nathanael to "come and see." May we take to heart the example of these apostles and invite others to come to know Christ. *Today's readings: Acts 1 Corinthians 15: 1–8; Psalm 19:2–3, 4–5; John 14:6–14.*

Saturday, May 4 Do You Accept?

The words "serve the Lord with gladness," in today's psalm shows the disposition one should have even when rejected and persecuted for living as Christians. As Jesus sets before the disciples the work of spreading the Gospel, he tells them that they will be treated as he has been: "If they persecuted me, they will also persecute you. If they kept my word, they will also keep yours." Are you able to live in gratitude to God even when others revile you? Pray to the Holy Spirit for such courage. *Today's readings: Acts 16:1–10; Psalm 100:1b–2, 3, 5; John 15:18–21.*
