GABRIEL PROJECT—We help pregnant women

In front of the church property our Gabriel Project sign states: The members of this church community see the birth of each baby as a fresh expression of God's unfailing love. We offer immediate and practical help to any

woman faced with a crisis pregnancy. We are currently helping two pregnant women and a woman with a newborn: "Sarah" is 24 years old and gave birth to her daughter earlier this month. We are helping her with her rent.

"Elizabeth" is 40 years old, single, and this is her first child. She is getting prenatal care and is high-risk. The pregnancy is at 20 weeks. Her needs are:

- 1. prayers (her pregnancy is high-risk)
- 2. diapers and wipes
- 3. housing

"Mary" is 25 years old and tenderly carrying a baby boy who is due at the end of August. She also has a sevenyear-old child who will be undergoing kidney surgery on May 20th at Stanford. Mary has a long history of foster care and more recently homelessness. Her needs are:

1. Prayers for her 7-year-old, her new baby, and herself 2. Boy baby clothes, new or gently used...any size up until 3 years old

- 3. Diapers and wipes...lots of them
- 4. Highchair

5. Any other item or gift for a new baby.

In it Pope Francis reiterates the **moral imperative** for all Catholics and for all of humanity **to make choices** about what we drive, what we eat, what we wear, what goods we buy that lessen the effects of climate change, for the sake of the vulnerable now, and for the sake of generations to come.

Easy Earth Care Actions. Each month, your Interfaith Dayenu Circle will be encouraging you to take a few quick actions that will benefit our planet and future generations. *Please note that these actions are being done across many faith organizations in Santa Cruz County, and you are part of a large interfaith effort!* Here's how you can make a difference:

- Email the California Assembly PERS Committee: Vote YES to Divest!. We need your help passing SB 252 (the Fossil Fuel Divestment Bill), which would require CalPERS and CalSTRS—the two largest public pension funds in the country—to divest over \$14 billion from fossil fuel companies. Timely: please click the link above to send a letter as soon as possible!
- Write Congress: Take the next climate policy step. New research shows we need to put a price on carbon emissions. Scenarios that include a carbon fee will deliver pollution reduction more effectively than other policy options.

• Defend Our Climate -Sign the Interfaith Power and Light Petition. The Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), the largest climate investment in American history, is under attack. Call on Congress to defend our climate progress for current and future generations and our Sacred Earth!

Feeling a possible call to the service of Deacon?

As the Church of Monterey continues to grow, our needs for the ministry of service continue to grow by leaps and bounds. The Deacon's ministry is threefold: to the service of **Charity/Justice**; service of the **Word**; and service of the **Liturgy**.

The Deacon is called to be a symbol of that service to which all God's People are called and indeed is to be an animator of lay ministry. Deacons serve **the poor** in many locations (Food Banks, Homeless Shelters, advocacy work), they provide services to the incarcerated, the sick and dying, migrants, those struggling with addictions, victims of violence, etc. They bring those experiences to their **ministries of Word** (preaching, teaching) and **Liturgical service**: presiding at Baptisms, Weddings, Funeral Vigils, and Committals, and assisting and preaching at Sunday Eucharist.

We welcome Fr. Joseph Hieu Do from the Diocese of Long Xuyen, Vietnam Mission Appeal – July 13 & 14, 2024

The Diocese of Long Xuyen covers two provinces of An Giang and Kien Giang plus parts of two districts that belong to the City of Can Tho. This region is located in the most south-western corner of Vietnam in the Mekong Delta that shares a border with Cambodia.

The Long Xuyen Diocese currently has over 236.213 faithful among approximately 4.2 million people or 5.58%, lower than the national average. It spreads out to 196 parishes in a region of about 6,500 square miles. We currently have 337 priests including 35 religious ones, about 367 religious sisters, 133 religious brothers, 122 seminarians, 166 preparatory students and nearly 1,634 catechists.

In 1954, the population of the faithful in this area was about 30,000. That was before the influx of the Catholic political refugees from North Vietnam moving into this fertile farming land. The official church records indicate that the above number increased to 93,739 in 1964. Again, we are caring for over 236,000 faithful nowadays.

Vietnam's population nationwide is shifting from countryside to more industrial cities or further into isolated rural lands. The latter is of our most concern since many Catholics are migrating away from their home parishes to the new land where there are neither churches nor catechetical schools.

The Long Xuyen Diocese has to build up to 5 chapels and many classrooms each year to accommodate these new Catholic Communities. We also must train many new catechists and evangelization volunteers for our efforts of the New Evangelization.
