Mass Intentions Policy

"One thing only I ask you, that you remember me at the altar of the Lord." (Saint Monica to her son Saint Augustine)



It is the ancient and longstanding practice of the Church to offer masses for special intentions of its members, especially for those who have died.

While all masses are offered for all members of the Church, both living and deceased, our special intentions for the deceased bring special graces to them and comfort to those who love them.

Here at Resurrection Parish we are allowed to accept up to three special intentions for each mass. This limitation sometimes presents challenges in scheduling the many requests that we receive each week, especially requests for several masses for one individual.

In order to fairly accommodate the many mass intention requests, we will implement a new policy beginning in January of 2025. Multiple mass intention requests for one individual will be limited to 1 weekend mass and 1 weekday mass per month per requestor. In other words, you can request up to 1 weekend and 1 weekday mass intention per month for a specific person, for a total of up to 24 mass intentions each year for that person.

This adjustment will allow, with greater fairness, more people to request mass intentions for their loved ones. It will also leave room for mass intentions for those who pass away throughout the calendar year.

Another way to remember your loved ones who have died at mass is during the Prayer of the Faithful, when we ask people to call out the names of those who have died.

Thank you for your understanding as we open up the mass intention requests to more members of the community.

MARKEY COMMUNITY CENTER PROJECT UPDATE 11-01-24

After 4 1/2 years, the permit for our insurance claim for the February 2020 tree damage to Markey Community Center repairs has been granted! We are currently just waiting for the green light from insurance to begin. Please pray that this happens soon!

In addition to repairing the actual damage to the hall, the county is also requiring that our building be brought up to current codes, including fire sprinklers, kitchen upgrades, ADA bathrooms, and ADA path-of-travel for the entire property.

The work will accomplish some of our original remodel project, which will be completed at a future date. (For insurance purposes, we had to separate the two projects so that

all the work required to repair the damage and meet current building codes would be paid for with the insurance settlement.)

We are hoping that the work will begin soon. Once construction begins it will take at least a year. (If possible, we'd like to start the rest of our remodel project near the end of the repair project, so this may extend the overall work time.)

This, of course, will impact most of our ministries and activities, and we will gracefully adapt! Our Tuesday homeless shelter is being hosted by other churches in the AFC network and with meals are still provided by our parishioners. Our friends at St. John's Episcopal Church in Seacliff are hosting the shower ministry, still staffed by our volunteers.

Let us patiently endure this time of change with generosity, hope, and gratitude for a better, safer, and more accessible community center!

CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME

We are working with other faith communities to learn how we can work together to make better choices and to advocate for better policies and practices in our region to reduce our human impact on climate change. We can all be more conscious of how our individual, daily choices either increase greenhouse gases or reduce them. This can all seem overwhelming and hopeless at times. What difference can I make?

Pope Francis published a follow-up to his ground-breaking 2015 encyclical Laudato Si, Laudato Deum "Praise God". (Read Laudato Deum on our website https://resurrection-aptos.org, under Resource Center under Faith Formation.) In it Pope Francis reiterates the moral imperative for all Catholics and for all of humanity to make choices about what we drive, what we eat, what we wear, what goods we buy that lessen the effects of climate change, for the sake of the vulnerable now, and for the sake of generations to come.

Here are 3 easy ways you can make a difference:

- Prioritize Climate: Write to your Representative and Senators to remind them that climate is a priority issue for people who voted in the election and to urge them to work together to prioritize climate legislation in the final weeks of this Congress.
- Urge Congress: Pass the U.S. Foundation for International Conservation Act. Scientists now estimate more than 1 million species are at risk of extinction, many within decades. Current funding levels fall drastically short for the urgent conservation work needed in essential habitats around the world. The International Conservation Act would provide significant funding to help local communities and Indigenous Peoples effectively manage conserved areas that vulnerable species call home.
- Positive News: Biden Pledges Amazon Aid in First-Ever Visit by a U.S. President to the Rainforest. Biden promised funding to protect Earth's largest tropical rainforest, and signed a proclamation making November 17 International Conservation Day. Biden announced a \$50 million contribution from the U.S. to the Amazon Fund to support biodiversity in the rainforest, plant native trees and restore lands. "The world's forest trees breathe carbon dioxide out of the atmosphere, and yet each minute, the world is chopping down the equivalent of 10 soccer fields worth of forest," Biden told reporters. "



"Am I not here, I who am your mother?"

December 12, 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"The Lord hears the cry of the poor" (Psalm 34:7), and we, the Catholic bishops of California, as shepherds of the flock of Christ, have seen and heard the growing distress among you, our migrant brothers and sisters. We want to assure you that we, and our mother, the Church, stand with you in these days of anxiety. You are not alone.

We realize that the calls for mass deportations and raids on undocumented individuals and migrant families have created genuine fear for so many we shepherd in our dioceses.

Rooted in the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the sacred dignity of every person, we commit to accompanying and walking in solidarity with you, our migrant brothers, sisters, and families through this uncertain time. We will shepherd you spiritually, gather information and resources, and continue to advocate for your dignity and family unity.

Our nation's immigration system is broken. The disarray at our southern border cannot be allowed to continue. We pray with you that any enacted policies restore a sense of security and peace for citizens as well as those seeking to find a home in this blessed land. To achieve that end, policies must reflect empathy and solicitude, with due regard for the rights of children and those fleeing violent and impoverished countries, while ceasing to provide respite for serious offenders.

Although the exact challenges that may arise are not yet clear, Catholic Charities throughout California will continue to serve as a trusted resource for those with questions or who need assistance. We invite our Catholic communities to follow the example of the Good Samaritan (cf. Lk. 10:34) and show compassion for our neighbors, especially the most vulnerable among us. Our parishes have the tradition of being havens of hope and solace for the lonely and the lost, embodying the peace that Christ gives. May Our Lady of Guadalupe, who reminded Juan Diego that he bore the image and likeness of God, remind all of us today and in the coming days that we are all beloved children of God, bearing his likeness, no matter our ethnicity or country of origin. May our care for each other speak to the dignity of every human being.

On this day, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, we are assured that we are never alone. In Our Lady's words to Saint Juan Diego on the hilltop of Tepeyac, we find the ultimate maternal example of compassion, protection, and love, with a promise that she is always with us:

"¿No estoy yo aquí, que soy tu madre?" "Am I not here, I who am your mother?"
Are you not under my shadow and protection? Am I not the source of your joy?
Are you not in the hollow of my mantle, in the crossing of my arms?
Do you need something more? Let nothing else worry you or disturb you" (Nican Mopohua).

We entrust you to the heart of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas. May you find comfort in her maternal mantle, and may her presence and intercession guide us toward compassionate humility toward one another.
