Dear brother priests, consecrated men and women and lay faithful of the Diocese of Monterey:

A week ago, last Tuesday, we began to witness the savage destruction of fires across the Los Angeles Metropolitan Area. Since then, we have seen and heard of countless images and stories of people doing everything they could to save or flee from their homes due to the horrific fires that confronted them. The fires, as we know, showed no mercy to personal homes, businesses, churches, people, and animals who lived in these areas. The destruction as we have seen is incomprehensible.

Thousands of people are literally homeless due to the fires throughout southern California. Many people have been asking "What can we do?" Prayers for sure are being offered up by many people, regardless of whether we know someone directly or indirectly impacted by the fires.

We lift up in prayer our firefighters, first responders, and emergency personnel who are trying to protect and save our brothers and sisters and their property. For those who have lost their lives in the fires, we ask God to draw them to himself and console their family and friends.

As the fires began to spread in Los Angeles last week, I was on retreat with the other bishops of our L.A. Province at the Cardinal Manning House of Prayer. We were praying for all who were being affected by the fires. We, too, were receiving constant emails, phone calls, and text messages from priests, deacons, and lay faithful who were experiencing this unexpected horror. My heart goes out to all who have suffered any tragedy or loss due to the fires. Let us keep each other in prayer in the days going forward.
