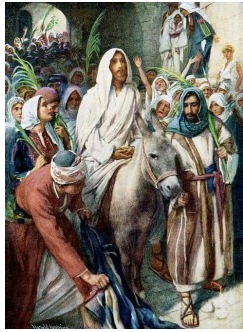

THE MASS NEVER ENDS—IT MUST BE LIVED!

We are invited to continue to reflect upon the Gospel reading (Luke 19:28-40 & Luke 22:14-23:56) and homily as we live out our Eucharist this week. Reflect upon it in your heart and mind, and discuss it with your family, friends and faith community members.

- Imagine yourself at the Palm Sunday entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem. Where are you in the crowd? What are you doing?
- Jesus journeyed to Jerusalem to experience the ultimate Passover: from death to life through his cross and resurrection. How has your Lenten journey brought you to the cross, or the cross to you? How are you now anticipating the Passover from death to new life at Easter?
- Jesus lived out Isaiah's "Suffering Servant" – "He was spurned and avoided by people, a man of suffering, accustomed to infirmity, one of those from whom people hide their faces..." How do you hide from the suffering people you encounter? How do you embrace them?

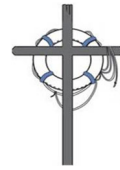

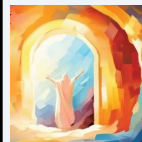

EASTER STORY COOKIES

To be made the evening before Easter (Holy Saturday)

You need:

1 cup whole pecans	1 tsp. vinegar	3 egg whites
Pinch salt	1 cup sugar	
zipper baggie	Wooden spoon	
Tape	Bible	

Preheat oven to 300 degrees (this is important—don't wait until you're half done with the recipe!)

Place pecans in zipper baggie and let children beat them with the wooden spoon to break into small pieces. Explain that after Jesus was arrested, He was beaten by the Roman soldiers. Read John 19:1-3.

Let each child smell the vinegar. Put 1 tsp. vinegar into mixing bowl. Explain that when Jesus was thirsty on the cross, He was given vinegar to drink. Read John 19:28-30.

Add eggs whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life. Explain that Jesus gave His life to give us life. Read John 10:10-11.

Sprinkle a little salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it and brush the rest into the bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers, and the bitterness of our own sin. Read Luke 23:27.

So far, the ingredients are not very appetizing. Add 1 cup sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to Him. Read Psalm 34:8 and John 3:16.

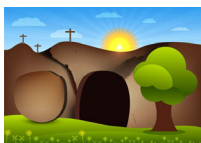
Beat with a mixer on high speed for 12 to 15 minutes until stiff peaks are formed. Explain that the color white represents the purity in God's eyes of those who sins have been cleansed by Jesus. Read Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3.

Fold in broken nuts. Drop by teaspoons onto wax paper covered cookie sheet. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. Read Matthew 27:57-60.

Put the cookie sheet in the oven, close the door and turn the oven OFF. Give each child a piece of tape and seal the oven door. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. Read Matthew 27:65-66.

GO TO BED! Explain that they may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven overnight. Jesus' followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed. Read John 16:20, 22.

On Easter morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies are hollow! On the first Easter, Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty. Read Matthew 28:1-9

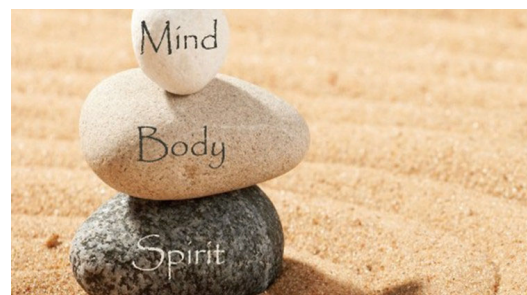
