

SAINTS OF THE WEEK:

January 20: St. Fabian, Pope, Martyr. Fabian was a layperson when he was elected pope in the year 236. According to the early Church historian Eusebius, Fabian came into the city from his farm while the papal election was in progress, and a dove settled on his head, leading the clergy and people to choose him Bishop of Rome! He served for 14 years and was martyred during the persecution of Decius in 250. **St. Sebastian, Martyr.** Sebastian was from Milan, and served as a soldier in the Roman army. He went to Rome to protest the persecution of his fellow Christians by the emperor, and when it was discovered that he was a Christian, he was tied to a post and shot full of arrows. He survived, recovered, and was later beaten to death for continuing to denounce the emperor's cruelty to Christians.

January 21: St. Agnes, Virgin, Martyr. Agnes was a beautiful young girl from a wealthy Roman family in the 3rd century who wanted to give herself to God alone. This was not accepted by her family, who wanted her to marry. When she persisted in her refusal to marry, she was sent live in a house of prostitution. God gave her the grace to preserve her virginity, and she was finally martyred.

January 22: St. Vincent, Deacon, Martyr. Vincent was a deacon in Saragossa, Spain who was imprisoned, tortured and killed in 303 along with his bishop, St. Valerius.

January 24: St. Francis de Sales, Bishop, Doctor. Francis was born in Savoy, France in 1567. After studying law he trained for the priesthood and was ordained in Geneva. He worked to restore Catholicism there and became bishop of Geneva in 1602. Francis was known for his compassion for all people and for his preaching and teaching. He taught that holiness is for everyone and that centering our lives on God is the way to do it.


