All Fridays in Lent and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat for everyone age 14 & older. Good Friday is also a day of fasting (one full meal, two smaller meals, and nothing in between for those from their 21st birthday to the day after their 59th birthday) That is the letter of the law, but the spirit of the law is to make a real sacrifice in union with Jesus who sacrificed himself to save us.
