2026 Summer Festival

- **Much Ado About Nothing July 12, 2:00 PM preview** One of Shakespeare's wittiest and most beloved comedies. Of all the couples in Shakespeare, perhaps none is more widely loved than Beatrice and Benedict. Their battle of wits, their antagonism turned to eroticism, their history. The audience, like the other characters in the play, wait with excitement as their wits clash, and eventually, as their love blossoms.
- **Macbeth July 15, 8:00 PM preview** Dark, bloody, brutal, and magnificent, William Shakespeare's Macbeth is one of the greatest plays ever written. Its central couple, ironically, is one of Shakespeare's happiest. A powerful unit, wildly in love with each other, the Macbeths follow the insinuations of the witches – the famous weird sisters – and commit murder in the name of their shared ambition: the throne of Scotland. But even with their goal achieved, Macbeth's paranoia and guilt lead him further down the road of blood.

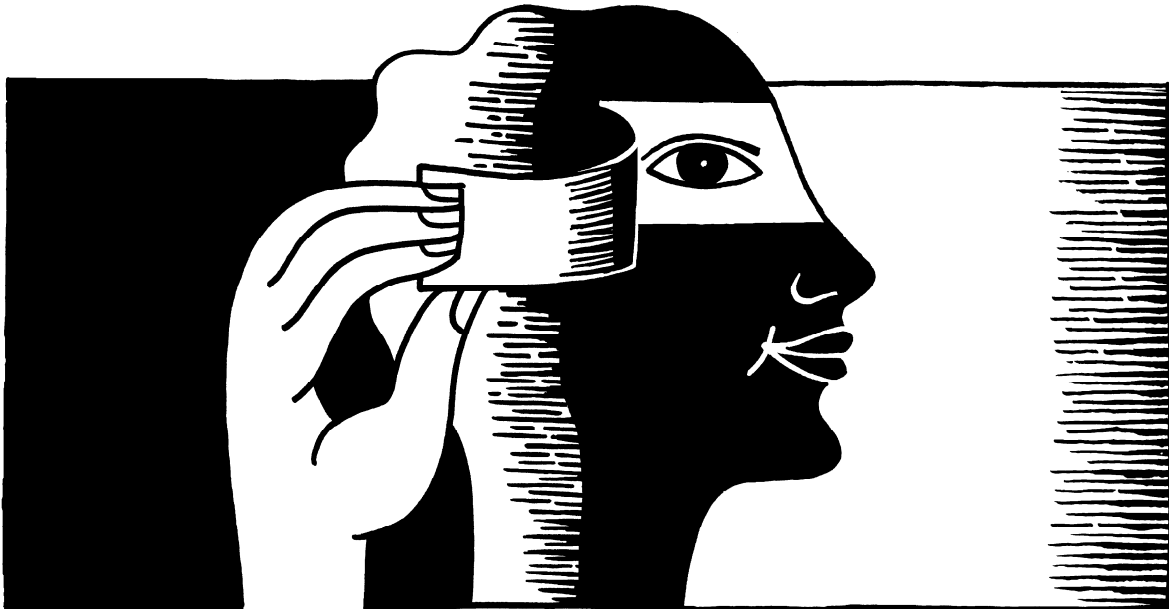

What Gets Changed?

A few years ago at a parish in Cleveland, some Catholics were interviewed about going to Mass. One of the questions was: “At Mass, when we pray and sing, when the priest stands at the altar and we pray over the bread and wine, when we come to holy communion, what gets changed?”

One middle-aged man named Sam answered quick as a wink and spoke straight from his heart: “What gets changed? Sam! Sam gets changed.”

Baptism got us into this house, this Catholic house. Sunday eucharist trains us in the life and language and loving deeds of Catholics. It gets us around that table where from the first generation of Christians we’ve been gathered to give God thanks over bread and wine. Doing that again and again changed Sam. Little by little, it changes us all. The most sacred mystery of the eucharist is that this bread and wine become for us the body and blood of Christ.



Now that man, whether he realized it or not, knew the church’s theology deep down in his being. He had experience—not just book learning—of the church’s theology of the eucharist.

At our baptism, we put on Christ. We died, we renounced, we turned our backs on whole ways of life. If we were baptized as infants, then our parents meant us to enter on such a Catholic life. At baptism, whether as an infant or an adult, the people already baptized took us into a home. And in that home we do the things that Catholics do, we try to live with others the way the gospels and our saints show us. We try to be one of those to whom the Lord will say: “I was hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me a drink, in prison and you visited me.”

The most sacred mystery of the eucharist is that we, slackers and sinners all, become the body and blood of Christ. So what gets changed? Sam gets changed.
